The Middle Tennessee Genealogical Society was established in December of 1986 to encourage and promote genealogy and for the collection and preservation of genealogical records.

Numerous unofficial meetings were held in early 1986 to develop policies, by-laws and a slate of officers. Our first official meeting was held April 25 and included a program by our Vice President Shirley Wilson on the value of loose court records to genealogy. Mrs. Wilson is Chairman of the Sumner County Archives Commission and has been working for the past four years on the preparation of Sumner County's loose records for microfilming by the Tennessee State Library and Archives. Her talk described the many different types of documents found among the loose records and demonstrated their value in comparison to records in book form.

Ideas being considered for future programs include presentations on Civil War research, Cherokee Indians, and bridging the genealogical gap from one state to another.

As a fledgling organization, we need help from our membership in many areas. We want to know how you envision this society functioning. One of our first goals is to develop a Membership and Publicity Committee which will consist of county representatives. We hope to have a representative from every middle Tennessee county serving on the committee. Some of you have already expressed an interest in serving and we will be contacting you soon. Let us know where and how you'd like to serve. There certainly isn't a shortage of jobs!

Our membership is growing rapidly. Dues are \$10 per person or \$15 per family. You will be considered a charter member if your dues are paid by August 15, 1987. A list of our current members and an application form are included in this publication.

Our thanks to Dr. John McGlone of the Tennessee State Library & Archives for his support and encouragement in the early stages of our development.

Members are encouraged to submit queries, information on coming events and publications as well as general items of genealogical interest. No formal policy has yet been developed by the Board of Directors as to the type of material to be published or the format to be used. We welcome member input.

At least two middle Tennessee counties now have archives which are open to the public. If you know of others, please send us specific information on them so that we can inform our membership.

The Robertson County archives is located in Springfield near the courthouse and is open 20 hours a week - Monday to Friday 8:00 a.m. to 12:30. The loose records have been prepared for research and are available there.

The Sumner County archives is located in the old post office building off the square in Gallatin. It is open Monday to Friday 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. In addition to county records, census records for Sumner County 1820 to 1880 and the Mormon IGI (International Genealogical Index) for the U. S. are available.

FROM THE PRESIDENT...

We were pleased to see so many enthusiastic genealogists at our August meeting - more than we anticipated! We apologize for the lack of adequate seating. Our thanks to Marylyn Bell Hughes, Senior Archivist, for an in-teresting talk on the Tennessee State Library, given under adverse conditions. Our board has solved the space problem by scheduling our meeting at Tennessee State University. TSU is located on Charlotte Avenue, about three blocks west of the Capitol. There is a parking lot adjacent to the building and we believe you'll be much more comfortable with this location. Our normal meeting day will be the third Saturday, but note that this meeting is scheduled for the SECOND Saturday because TSU was booked for the third. The time was changed to 1:00 p.m. because of shorter days in the fall.

On behalf of the entire Board of Directors, I would like to thank Rev. Isham Harris Jr. for his service as President in our formation stage. Rev. Harris resigned in August following our quarterly meeting. According to our by-laws, the Vice President assumes the presidency for the remainder of the term. Other vacancies on the board are to be filled by the remaining board members. These board members met on August 29, 1987 and unanimously voted to ask board member Irene Griffey to accept the position of Vice President. My personal thanks to you, Irene, for your willingness to serve in this capacity.

Several policy decisions were made by the board at our last meeting which I would like to share with you. Because of the proximity of the Tennessee State Library and Archives as well as the Nashville Room of the public library, it was decided that our society will not at the present time accept genealogical materials other than those which we intend to publish. Members who have materials to donate are encouraged to contact the aforementioned libraries.

Because of the large number of professional genealogists in our membership, it was necessary to address the issue of how inquiries for genealogical assistance would be handled. It was decided to develop a list of researchers similar to the list distributed by TSLA. Those researchers who would like to have their name included on this list will be asked to complete a form, from which the list will be prepared. Persons inquiring will be given this list along with the names and addresses of persons from our Surname File who are working on their family. No research will be performed by the society.

We know that there are many of you who are able and willing to help with our society's activities. In an effort to find out what you expect of the society and what abilities you have to offer the society, we are enclosing a membership survey. Our goal is to involve every member who wants to become involved. Please take the time to complete the form and return it to us.

At each quarterly meeting, a table for the display of publications of a genealogical nature will be provided within our meeting room. Members and their guests may bring sample publications, advertisements, and order forms. TSU prohibits the actual sale of materials on their premises. The Society assumes no responsibility for loss or damage to any materials which are displayed at the meetings.

BYLAWS OF THE MIDDLE TENNESSEE GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY

ARTICLE I. Name. The name of this non-profit organization shall be THE MIDDLE TENNESSEE GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY.

ARTICLE II. Objectives. The objectives of this organization shall be to create and stimulate interest in the study of genealogy and family history; to collect, preserve and make available to others genealogical information pertaining to Middle Tennessee; to provide assistance to others in genealogical pursuits through all means available or developed by this society.

ARTICLE III. Membership and Dues. **Section 1.** Any person interested in the study and pursuit and preservation of genealogy and family history shall be eligible for membership. Membership shall be granted upon submission of application and payment of dues. **Section 2.** Dues shall be payable on or before the first day of June each year in an amount set annually by the Board of Directors of the society. **Section 3.** No member shall be deemed a member in good standing whose dues shall be in arrears for more than thirty (30) days. The Treasurer shall notify the member of the delinquency and advise that the member will be dropped from membership unless dues are paid within thirty (30) days.

ARTICLE IV. Officers. **Section 1.** The officers of this society shall be a President, a Vice President, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, and a Treasurer. **Section 2.** At the regular meeting in November, a Nominating Committee of five (5) persons shall be elected by the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall appoint the chairman of this committee. It shall be the duty of this committee to nominate candidates for the offices to be filled at the annual meeting in May. The Nominating Committee shall report at the regular meeting in February. Before the election at the meeting in May, additional nominations from the floor shall be permitted. Each candidate shall have consented to the nomination. **Section 3.** The officers shall be elected by ballot to serve for one year or until their successors are elected and assume office. Their term of office shall begin at the close of the annual meeting in May. In the event there is only one candidate for any office, voting on that office may be by voice vote. **Section 4.** No member shall hold more than one office at a time except Secretary as outlined in Article IV, Section 6, Part C (4); and no member shall be eligible to serve more than two consecutive terms in the same office. **Section 5.** (A) A vacancy in the office of President shall be filled by the Vice President who shall succeed to the office of President for the remainder of the term. (B) If a vacancy should occur during the year in any office other than Presidency, the vacancy shall be filled through appointment by the Board of Directors. **Section 6. The President shall:** 1. Preside at all meetings of the association and the Board of Directors. 2. Appoint all Standing Committee Chairpersons and such other committees as authorized by the society or Board of Directors. 3. Be an ex-officio member of all committees except the Nominating Committee. 4. Appoint a member to serve as Parliamentarian. 5. Perform other duties as pertain to the office of President. **B. The Vice President shall:** 1. Be an active aid to the President. 2. Conduct him/herself so as to obtain the greatest possible acquaintance with the affairs of the society. 3. In the event of the absence or inability of the President to perform his/her duties, the Vice President shall perform the duties of and have the authority and privileges of the President. **The Recording Secretary shall:** 1. Take minutes of the meetings of the society and the Board of Directors; keep a permanent, continuous record of all activities of the society; make a report of the written record at each meeting. 2. Maintain an accurate list of membership. 3. Perform other duties as pertain to this office. 4. In the event the office of corresponding secretary is not filled, at the request of the Board of Directors, perform the duties of that office. (D) **The Corresponding Secretary shall:** 1. Notify all members of meetings. 2. Conduct the correspondence of the society as directed by the President or Board of Directors. 3. Perform other duties as pertain to this office. (E) **Treasurer shall:** 1. Receive and deposit all funds of the society in a suitable depository bank. 2. Receive all monies and disburse funds only upon the sanction of the Board of Directors of the society. 3. Submit a full written report at each regular meeting giving full account of all financial transactions. 4. Maintain a permanent record of all receipts. 5. Submit all financial records for audit annually by a committee selected by the Board of Directors. 6. It shall be the Treasurer's responsibility to file Form 990 and 990T with the Internal Revenue Service, and any state or local tax forms required. **F. The Immediate Past President shall:** 1. Serve as a member of the Board of Directors for one year following the term of office as President. **Section 7.** In the event an officer or director fails to attend at least one half (1/2) of the stated meetings without valid reason or just cause, the office held by such person(s) shall be declared vacant and a new officer shall be elected by the Board of Directors to serve the unexpired term.

ARTICLE V. County Representatives: **Section 1.** A representative from each Middle Tennessee county represented by membership in the society shall be appointed annually by the Board of Directors. **Section 2.** It shall be the duty of each appointed county representative to act as a liaison between the society and that county; to publicize information pertaining to the activities of the society as directed by the Public Relations and Membership Committee or Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VI. Meetings. Section 1. The regular meetings of the society shall be held on the third Saturday of May, August, November and February, unless otherwise ordered by the society or Board of Directors. Section 2. The fiscal year shall begin on the first day of June and end on the last day of May. The regular meeting in May shall be known as the annual meeting and shall be for the purpose of election of officers, receiving reports of officers and committees, and any other business that may arise. Section 3. Special meetings may be called by the President or by the Board of Directors or upon the written request of ten (10) members. The purpose of the meeting shall be stated in the call. Except in cases of emergency, at least thirty (30) days' notice shall be given. Section 4. Fifteen (15) members shall constitute a quorum at any regular or special meeting.

ARTICLE VII. Board of Directors. Section 1. The Officers of this society and four (4) Directors shall constitute the Board of Directors. The Directors of the society shall be elected at annual meetings of the society and shall serve for a term of two (2) years except that, at the first election, one half (1/2) of the members of the Board of Directors shall be elected to serve for one year, and one half (1/2) for two years. Thereafter, one half (1/2) of the members of the Board of Directors are to be elected annually. Any member of the Board of Directors who shall have served as much as two consecutive terms of two years each shall be ineligible for re-election for a period of one year immediately following the expiration of such second full term. Section 2. The Board of Directors shall have general supervision of the affairs of the society between its business meetings, make recommendations to the membership and perform such other duties as are specified in these Bylaws. The Board shall be subject to the orders of the membership and none of its acts shall conflict with action taken by the society. The Board of Directors shall meet quarterly, unless otherwise ordered by the society at a place and time determined by the Board. Section 3. The Board of Directors shall develop annually a budget for approval by the society at the annual meeting, and shall have authority to expend funds not to exceed one hundred (\$100.00) dollars without prior approval of the society. Section 4. It shall be the responsibility of the Board of Directors to develop a policy for answering requests directed to the society for general information and/or genealogical research: develop and approve all public releases pertaining to the society. Section 5. A majority of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE VIII. Committees. Section 1. There shall be the following standing committees: Program; Collection and Archives; Public Relations and Membership; Publications and such other committees as may be authorized by the society or Board of Directors. Section 2. Duties of Standing Committees: A. The Program Committee shall: 1. Arrange a program for presentation at each of the quarterly meetings of the society. 2. Any seminars sponsored by the society shall come under the direction of this committee. B. The Collections and Archives Committee shall: 1. Receive and process any genealogical information received by the society in a form directed by the Board of Directors so as to preserve and make such information accessible to the public. C. The Public Relations and Membership Committee shall: 1. Be composed of county representatives and shall actively seek new members for the society. 2. Publicize information pertaining to the society as directed by the Board of Directors. D. The Publications Committee shall: 1. Prepare materials for publication as approved by the Board of Directors. 2. Direct all publication of such material as approved by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IX. Parliamentary Authority. ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER NEWLY REVISED shall be the parliamentary authority for all matters of procedure for this association not specifically covered by its bylaws and standing rules.

ARTICLE X. Amendment of Bylaws. These bylaws may be amended at any regular meeting by a two thirds (2/3) vote of members present provided that the amendment has been submitted in writing at the previous meeting or has been mailed to the entire membership at least thirty (30) days prior to the meeting at which they shall be considered.

ARTICLE XI. Dissolution of the Society. To effect dissolution of this society, these bylaws must be rescinded by a two thirds (2/3) vote of the members present after thirty (30) days notice has been mailed to each member. In the event of dissolution, all assets and holdings of the society shall be converted into an acceptable form and presented to the Tennessee State Library and Archives.

ARTICLE XII. Section 1. No society member shall accept remuneration for any research or general information request DIRECTED to the society. Section 2. This society shall be operated as a non-profit organization and no part of the assets or net earnings shall inure to the benefit of any private individual.

RESEARCHING YOUR CONFEDERATE ANCESTORS

Many of you may already know of the well-traveled avenues of Genealogical Research Materials which are available in tracing Civil War and Confederate Ancestry. Beginning with the thousands of reels of microfilm of State Regimental Muster Rolls, and continuing on through the 532 reels of microfilm known as the Confederate Consolidated Index, the Service Records, Pension Records (Soldier & Widow), there are so many well known research tools available on this era, that at times it may overwhelm and even intimidate the average researcher.

Let me instead point out some of the often overlooked, yet very informational publications which we may pass over in our haste to uncover what we conceive to be that "Motherload" of names and dates.

You may well find a "gold mine" of information on your Confederate ancestors in a little known, six volume, edition of the "Medical & Surgical History of the War of the Rebellion" which deals with diseases and wounds suffered by both Confederate and Union soldiers. The numerous descriptive lists give: Name, age, rank, regiment, type of wound or disease, date wounded or nature of injury, operations with name of surgeon and results (whether death or recovery). In some instances, there may be drawings from photographs of the soldier which display his wounds and give some physical description of the soldier.

County history publications may also give descriptive rosters of the Confederate Soldiers who served from that particular county and may include Family Histories giving date of enlistment, age and death dates, burials, etc.

You will also find the 40 volume edition of the "Confederate Veteran Magazine" an invaluable research treasure of facts, names, obits, personal reminiscences, biographical sketches, and letters asking help in contacting old veterans who may have moved after the war. You may even find the one obituary you have hunted for so long, with an accompanying photograph you never even knew existed. With the newly published "Cumulative Index: The Confederate Veteran Magazine, 1893-1932" you will have an easier time in pouring over the 250,000 name entries and 165,000 different names.

You should also check the minutes and records of the meetings of various historic groups such as: the United Daughters of the Confederacy, the United Confederate Veterans, and the Sons of Confederate Veterans, as they will provide you with names, addresses, and interesting data on the members and their on-going projects during that time.

These are just a few of the research tools we will be discussing during the November 14th meeting on some additional avenues of research material available to you in tracing your Confederate Ancestors.

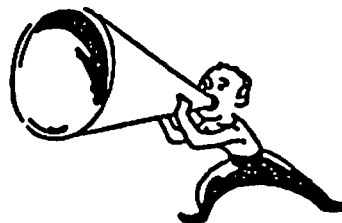

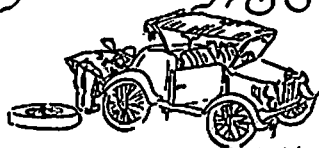

Early Davidson County included all of Middle Tennessee. Metropolitan Government Archives, located at 1113 Elm Hill Pike, Nashville, Tennessee 37210, houses some of these earliest records and, of course, houses the records of Nashville.

Virginia Lyle began working with Metro in 1981. Plans were formulated by the Public Library for establishment of Archives. Her education includes a B. A. in History and a Master's in Library Science as well as completion of Bill Saffady's course in records management at Peabody. PART ONE 1788 - 1798

The Judicial District of Washington was formed in 1784 by the General Assembly of North Carolina and included Washington, Sullivan, Greene and Davidson Counties in the area now Tennessee.

The counties of Davidson, Sumner and Tennessee, North Carolina (now Tennessee) were organized in 1788 into a separate judicial district and named Mero District. The Superior Court of Law and Equity of Davidson County North Carolina (now Tennessee) became the Superior Court for the District of Mero. This district actually covered the middle Tennessee counties known today as Montgomery, Robertson, Sumner, Macon, Clay, Pickett, Jackson, Smith, Trousdale, Wilson, Davidson, Cheatham and a portion of Stewart, Houston, Dickson, Williamson, Rutherford, Cannon, DeKalb, Putnam and Overton.

When the area was included in the Territory South of the River Ohio in 1789, it became subject to the laws of the United States. The three counties known then as Davidson, Sumner and Tennessee formed the Judicial District of Mero. The Inferior Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions was held in each of the counties. The Territorial Court was called the Superior Court of Law and Equity.

David Campbell, John McNairy and Joseph Anderson were appointed district judges by President Washington. Governor William Blount licensed Josiah Love, John Overton, Andrew Jackson, David Allison, Howell Tatum, James Cole Montflorenc and James White attornies to practice in the Mero District. David Allison was appointed Clerk of the Superior Court of Law for Mero District and Joseph Sitgraves was appointed Clerk and Master in Equity. Andrew Jackson was appointed Attorney General for the District of Mero.

No case was heard in the Superior Court of Law for debts or demands of less than one hundred pounds. The Superior Court had the power to correct errors of any inferior court and any person, either plaintiff or defendant, who was dissatisfied with the decree of any county court could appeal to the district court.

When Tennessee became a state in 1796, the legislature was given the power to establish and direct the superior and inferior courts of law and equity. The legislature on March 28, 1796, appointed three judges to hold the Court of Law and Equity. Each term of Court of Law and Equity was allowed to continue fifteen judicial days and the court could not hear any case in which the debt or demand was less than fifty dollars.

The District of Mero was soon divided into three judicial districts. Robertson, Dickson, Montgomery and Stewart Counties formed the District of Robertson and held two courts of law and equity in Clarksville each year. Jackson, Smith and Wilson Counties became a separate district of Winchester and held two courts of law and equity in Carthage each year. The counties of Davidson, Sumner, Williamson and Rutherford remained the District of Mero.

Since the Minutes of the Superior Court of North Carolina including Mero District 1788-1803 covered the entire settled area of Middle Tennessee at that time, these minutes were selected as a continuing article for Middle Tennessee Genealogy. The WPA copy of the minutes is being used. It is recommended that reference be made to the microfilm copy of the original minutes when an item of interest is found.

Col. JOHN HOGAN FAMILY of MONTGOMERY COUNTY, TENNESSEE

by Cleo G. Hogan, JD

Col. John Hogan is the progenitor of most Montgomery County, TN Hogans. He was a Revolutionary war militia officer from Orange County, NC, and came to what is now Montgomery County in 1795. He purchased 1047 acres of land on Big Brush Creek in that year, which descendants held into the 1880's. Col. Hogan was born ca. 1745, probably in Prince William Co, VA, and was probably a son of Thomas Hogan whose will dated 1776 was probated there in 1779. Col. Hogan died ca. 1810 probably on the Brush Creek Farm, and is probably buried there in the family cemetery, though his gravesite is not marked. He married about 1770 Orange Co, NC to Mary Lloyd, daughter of Maj. Thomas Lloyd III, who was a colonial Orange Co, NC official.

Col. Hogan first appears in Orange Co, NC as bailor in 1765. He bought a farm there in 1772, which passed to his brother Daniel Hogan (1753-1787) when Col. John came to Tennessee. This farm in 1988 is partly in the possession of the family, and is known as Lake Hogan Farm, an operating dairy farm two miles from Chapel Hill, NC. The Minute Men of Orange County elected John Hogan their Colonel in 1775. He was Chairman of the Safety Committee there in 1776, a JP in 1777, County Trustee in 1778, and a Senator in the NC General Assembly from Orange County in 1779. In 1792, he donated 200 acres to help establish the University of NC at Chapel Hill, and contracted to make the brick to build the first building, Old East, in 1793, the oldest State University building in the nation. His son-in-law, John Kimble, was one of the bricklayers.

Col. John Hogan and Mary (Lloyd) Hogan had six known children, three of whom came to Montgomery County with him in 1795--Thomas, John, Jr., and Margaret Lloyd (Hogan) Kimble, wife of John Kimble. William Hogan (1774-1836), another son removed to Randolph Co, NC, where he established a large family. Alexander Hogan, another son married Eliza Osborne and removed to Iredell Co, NC. Son James has not been located.

Thomas Hogan (ca.1771-ca.1852) married Tabitha "Abi" Stroud in 1795 in Orange Co, NC, and came to Montgomery Co, TN, but removed to Christian Co, KY by 1805, where he had at least six children, and died there about 1852.

Margaret Lloyd Hogan married 1794 Orange Co, NC, John Kimble, and came to Montgomery Co, TN in 1795. He was a brickmason, and in 1804 was an innkeeper at Clarksville, TN. No record has been located of them after that date.

John Hogan, Jr. (1773-1818) married 1792 Orange Co, NC Martha Ann King (1774-1856), probably a neice of Baxter King of Orange Co. Both John, Jr. and Martha have gravemarkers in the Hogan Cemetery on the Brush Creek Farm. The farm passed to this couple, and they reared ten children there: William B., Wiley, Mary, Alexander, Sarah, Nancy, Howard, Lucinda, John (III) and James W.

William B. Hogan (1794-1834), son of John Hogan, Jr., married 1814 Montgomery Co, TN, Mary "Polly" Rudolph (1795-1837). They lived on the Brush Creek Farm, reared nine children there, and are buried there in the Hogan Cemetery. Their nine children were: Henry S. Hogan (1815-aft 1878), married 1836 Lucinda Burney, had ten children, and moved to McCracken Co, KY by 1860; David T. Hogan (1816-1847), married ca. 1835 Amitta _____, and died in the Mexican War as a Pvt, Co. C, Arkansas Mounted Infantry; Margaret Hogan (1821-aft 1876), married ca. 1838 Edmond A. Pace and had six children, and moved to Lawrence Co, MO by 1850, and to Benton Co, Arkansas by 1870; Martha Ann Barnett Hogan (1823-aft.1861),

married 1840 Thomas J. Whitworth, had two daughters, and lived at McCracken Co, KY in 1850, and Lawrence Co, MO in 1861; Mary J. Hogan (1825-aft 1850), no further information; Emily Caroline Hogan (1828-1854), married 1848 Cornelius E. Morgan, Sr., had a daughter Cornelia Morgan; William B. Hogan, Jr. (1830-), no information; Rev. James Franklin Hogan (1833-1899), married 1855 Springfield, MO Elizabeth Powell, had no children, buried at Windsor, Henry Co, MO; and Elijah Alexander Hogan (1835-1880), married 1) Elizabeth Gladdish, 2) Rebecca Barnes, 3) Mrs. M.E. Weaver, had issue, and died at Bertrand, Mississippi Co, MO.

Willie "Wiley" Hogan (1797-1856) married 1816 Montgomery Co., TN Elizabeth Rudolph (1799-aft 1856), sister of Mary Rudolph, reared eight children on the Brush Creek Farm, and are buried in the Hogan Cemetery there. The eight children were: Jacob R. Hogan (1819-1890's), married 1842 Montgomery Co, TN, Ann Burton (1824-1896), had five sons, and moved to Golconda, IL after 1860; John M. Hogan (ca.1830-), married 1850 Montgomery Co, TN Sarah J. Burton, no information; Jane Hogan (ca.1832-), married 1855 James T. Morgan, who died of burns in their house fire in 1860, issue unknown; Wiley J. Hogan (ca.1834-18), married 1856 Mary E. Myers, had six children, moved by 1860 to Wickliffe, Ballard Co, KY, where they are buried; Margaret Hogan (ca.1825-by 1849), married 1842 Wade H. Morgan, had one son, Charles H. Morgan (1843-1928) of Montgomery Co, TN; Martha Ann Hogan (ca.1839-), married 1856 Montgomery Co, TN John Myers, issue unknown; Sarah Hogan (ca.1842-living 1856), no information; and Francis Tennessee Hogan (1845-1888) married 1) Cornelius Ervin Morgan, Jr., 2) William P. Clark, had four Morgan children and five Clark children, including Mattie E. Morgan (1870-1963) who married Charles R. Hogan, and triplets by Mr. Clark, the only known triplets ever in any Hogan family branch, but who all died in their sixteenth day. Francis T. Hogan Morgan Clark and several family members are buried on their farm near Wickliffe, Ballard Co, KY, now owned by the fifth generation of her descendants in the Dunn family.

Mary "Polly" Hogan (1800-1845) married 1820 Montgomery Co., TN Aquilla Wheless, (ca.1795-1846), reared nine children across Brush Creek on the Wheless farm, where they are buried in unmarked graves. Mr. Wheless was a longtime constable of the County, and was Sheriff at his death. The elder daughter, Martha Ann Wheless (1821-1845) married 1838 John Wilson, no further information. Wesley Wheless (1823-1861) married 1849 in Nashville, TN Susan Ann Hobson, was a banker in Nashville, and built a magnificent sixteen-room Gothic mansion on Wheless Street there in the 1850's, which later burned. At the early death of the parents, Wesley took the younger children to Nashville where they were reared. All but a daughter, Susan Wheless, married and had families. Wesley, James, Joseph and John F. are buried at Mount Olivet Cemetery at Nashville. Alexander Wheless (1825-1871) is buried in New Orleans; Mary A. Wheless (1832-1916) married 1850 Robert P. Bolling, and is buried at Elmwood Cemetery, Memphis, TN; and William T. Wheless (1835-1892) died at Augusta, GA. John F. Wheless (1839-1891) was a Captain in the Confederate Army.

Alexander "Sandy" Hogan (1802-1893) married ca.1823 Rebecca Weakley (1806-1847), and moved to Shackle Island, Sumner Co., TN, where they reared 11 children. After her death, he married 1850 Sumner Co, TN, Martha C. Barnes and had three children. He and the first wife and six of the eleven children are buried at the Old Beech Cumberland Presbyterian Church at Shackle Island, where he was an Elder. The children who had issue are: Narcissa E. Hogan (1824-1850), married W. A. Murray, and had two daughters; Sara Jane Hogan (1828-1853) married John H. Latimer, and had a son, James R. Latimer (ca.1852-); Alexander Hogan, Jr. (1837-1892) married Alexina Tucker, and had three children, all of whom died under age one, including two sons named Alexander. He was 2Lt, Co E, 7th Tennessee Infantry Regiment, CSA; Susannah Hogan (1841-1913) married 1860 James Garret Elizer, and had twelve children; and Theresa "Res" Hogan (1843-1914) married John Montgomery Guthrie, had 5 children, including Stanford E. Guthrie (1875-1918), Postmaster at Port Royal, Montgomery Co., TN, and Ara Guthrie (1877-1944), who married 1900 Arthur Bradbury, whose extensive farm in Montgomery County is in 1988 the "Bradbury Farms" development; Stanford Burney Hogan (1845-1909), married 1874 Martha E. Latimer, and had a son and a daughter; and by the last wife, Moza H. Hogan (ca.1858-1894) married Fannie Alston. He was a graduate of the Webb School, and was school principal at Dover, TN.

Sarah "Sally" Hogan (1804-) married 1821 Montgomery Co, TN, but the family Bible does not reveal to whom, and that has not been discovered, nor any other data on any family she may have had.

Nancy Hogan (1806-1846) did not marry, and remained on the Brush Creek Farm with her mother until her death, and was buried there in the Hogan Family Cemetery.

Howard Hogan (1808-1870's) married 1828 Montgomery Co, TN Harriet T. Gossett, and had eleven children. They moved from the Brush Creek Farm in Montgomery Co., to Sumner Co., TN between 1836 and 1840, leaving there after 1850 for Dyer Co, TN where they lived in 1860, then to Dunklin Co., MO by 1870, where Harriet lived in 1880, and where both are probably buried. The children were: Lucinda Hogan (ca. 1830-), no information; Mary Ann Hogan (1831-1872) married 1850 Johnson Co., Ark Wiley M. Harris and had 3 sons and 1 dau.; Martha Hogan (ca.1834-); Marinda Hogan (ca.1836-); John W. Hogan (ca.1838-aft 1870), married Amanda E. _____, had at least 3 sons, James, Richard and Robert born in the 1860's; Harriet Hogan (ca.1839-); China Hogan (ca.1841-); Alexander Hogan (ca.1843-); James Hogan (ca.1845-); William C. Hogan (1848-aft 1902), married 1870 Dunklin Co, MO Sarah E. Watts and had 4 sons and 1 daughter; then married ca.1900 Mallie E. Bell (1880-1970) and had 1 daughter at Tulsa, OK, where William C. is thought to have died; and Jesse D. Hogan (ca.1853-aft 1880) married ca.1878 Nancy J. (?Baker?), and had twins Alvis and Almora Hogan, lived in 1880 Dunklin Co, MO. Howard Hogan wrote his younger brother John in 1861 from Newbern, Dyer Co, TN that "good improved land is worth \$10 per acre, the people that owns land here is selling and moving to that country, it is pretty much on the line between Missouri and Arkansas, Randolph and Dunklin County, there is as good land there in the woods at one dollar per acre as you ever seed in the Cumberland Bottum".

Lucinda Hogan (1813-) married Alexander Kimble, who is remembered as having visited the Hogans near Wickliffe, Ballard Co, KY, where he left a foot-locker yet in the family there, but there is no further information. He did some chimney work for the family there, so there may be a brickmason connection to Lucinda's uncle John Kimble, but that is speculation.

John Hogan (1815-1903) married 1836 Montgomery Co, TN Caroline Melinda Holt (1817-1903). They had eleven children, and outlived all but three. John and his younger brother James divided up their share of the Brush Creek Farm and moved to nearby farms, John buying land on Reynolds Branch a few miles away, which he later sold to his son Starkey, moving in 1868 to the Hogan Farm on Little McAdoo Creek, where they lived until death. That farm is in 1988 owned by his last living grandson and two great-grandsons, including the writer. John and Caroline are buried at a cemetery they established on the Reynolds Branch Farm a mile away. John was a school trustee, Magistrate, and member of Mt Carmel Methodist Church. The children were: Elizabeth Ann Hogan (1837-1862), married 1859 John C. Weakley, had one surviving daughter, Fredonia E. Weakley (1860-1943) who married 1877 Thomas J. Basford and had issue; Martha Izabella "Belle" Hogan (1839-1919), married 1857 James Thomas "Tom" Weakley, brother of John C. Weakley and had 4 sons and 2 daus; Green F. Hogan (1841-1862), Pvt, Co G, 42 Tenn Inf Regt, CSA, died at Camp Douglas, Chicago, IL, where he is buried; John Thomas Hogan (1844-1863), Pvt, Co G, 42 Tenn Inf Regt, CSA, died at Camp Douglas, Chicago, IL, where he is buried; Starkey Norfleet Hogan (1847-1917), a stout and handsome man and a licensed Methodist preacher, married 1868 Harriet L. Chambliss, had 2 sons and 4 daughters, including twins, and remained at the Reynolds Branch Farm and is buried there; Rev. James Alexander "Sandy" Hogan (1849-1896), Baptist minister at Lowes, Graves Co, KY, married 1869 Montgomery Co, TN Lucy Rosina Nicholson, had five sons and four daughters, including the longest-lived Hogan of the name known, Charles F. Hogan (1873-1972); then four

children who died under age eight; Margaret Lucinda Hogan (1852-1859); George F. Hogan (1856-1859); Edward P. Hogan (1858-1858); infant daughter Hogan (1854-1854); and Frank Lafayette Hogan (1860-1941), Magistrate, member of Mt Carmel Methodist Church, Noble Grand of Fredonia Odd Fellows Lodge, IOOF, married 1881 Luetta Nicholson (1858-1888), married 1900 Josephine Minerva Craig (1866-1930), widow of J.N. Birney, had two sons by each wife, Josiah Winfred "Fred" Hogan (1882-1973), Rev. Alexander Rosson "Sandy" Hogan (1886-1978), Methodist minister, John Craig Hogan (1901-1987) of Baytown, TX, and Byron Gordon Hogan (1905-living 1988), owner of the 100-acre John Hogan Century Farm on Little McAdoo Creek, father of two sons who reside on the farm, Horace H. Hogan (1931-) and the writer, Cleo G. Hogan (1946-), Meteorologist, Genealogist and Attorney.

James Wesley Hogan (1818-1900) married 1) 1838 Margaret Morgan (ca.1819-1856), married 2) 1856 Caroline S. Weakley (1828-1893), last resident on the Hogan Brush Creek Farm, selling his share and purchasing a farm at the end of Frazier Road, Cheatham Co, TN where he lived before removing to Wickliffe, Ballard Co, KY where he is buried at Antioch Baptist Church Cemetery. His sketch appears in Goodspeed's History of Cheatham Co., TN. He had one child by the first wife, Amanda Eviline Hogan (1839-ca.1882), married Joseph Davis Burney, had 3 sons, 4 daughters. There were five sons by the second wife: George Washington Hogan (1858-1942), married 1886 Mary Ella Owens, had three children, both buried at Antioch Baptist Church, Ballard Co, KY; Shelva Luther "Shep" Hogan (1860-1951), married Frances Page; had seven children and they and children are buried at Livonia Cemetery, Wayne Co, MI (parents), or Pinckney, Livingston Co, MI or Ypsilanti, Wayne Co, MI, all having moved to the Detroit area about 1913, except infant son Shelby Hogan who is buried with the grandmother Caroline (Weakley) Hogan at the Weakley Cemetery, Cheatham Co., TN; John Anderson Hogan (1862-1925), married 1895 Addie H. Purcell, had six children, all of whom lived and died near Barlow, Ballard Co, KY; Alexander Hogan (1864-1864), died at Fredonia, Montgomery Co, TN; and Charles Robert Hogan (1866-1932), married his cousin, Mattie Elizabeth Morgan, granddaughter of Willie Hogan (1797-1856), q.v., had 1 son, who had no issue, and 1 daughter, Ressie B. Hogan (1898-1987), who married 1915 Harold E. Dunn and lived near Wickliffe, Ballard Co, KY, and who was of great assistance to the writer in compiling this information, and left two sons and two daughters.

The late Rev. Alexander R. Hogan, Pulaski, TN, the late Ressie Hogan Dunn, Wickliffe, KY, the late Charles C. Hogan, Ypsilanti, MI, William Johnston Hogan IV, Keysville, VA, Alberta Evans Carrigan, Clarksville, TN, and Beth Wise Stewart, Fairborn, OH are the six people who have encouraged and inspired this research over the past twenty years, assisting in innumerable ways in compiling the family data into two large notebooks in preparation for future publication. There are some fifty other persons who have assisted with their branches of the Hogan family, and who will be named one of these days when the publication is completed, but alas, must go unnamed in this brief sketch. To them are due the credit for this sketch.

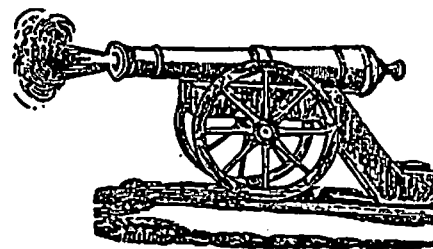
EDITOR'S NOTE

TENNESSEANS KILLED AT THE BATTLE OF FRANKLIN

November 30, 1864

A portion of the research material being prepared for publication of Sealed with Blood - Honored Graves - The Battle of Franklin Death Roster addresses the Distant Burials of Confederate Soldiers. The term Distant refers to their remains not being buried in the Carnton Confederate Cemetery in Franklin, Tennessee where sleep 1,481 of the 1,739 Confederate Soldiers killed or mortally wounded at the Battle of Franklin fought on November 30, 1864.

The Distant Burials I have so far identified and confirmed with the soldiers' reason of death being from wounds and not diseases have been categorized by States and at this time total 138. Of these, 61 are buried in the Confederate Circle at Mt. Olivet Cemetery, Nashville, Tennessee. These were wounded prisoners who died from their wounds and although first buried in Nashville's Old City Cemetery, were reinterred in Mt. Olivet immediately after the War. Of these 61, 57 are listed where they were once noted as only "UNKNOWN", and have no marker to mark the place of their burial, except the large monument that now stands above all of the Heroes who sleep here numbering 1,492 of which only 409 are KNOWN.

Following is a listing of the 36 Tennesseans so far identified with some personal history or information of them or of their burial with a photograph of their tombstone where available.

I encourage any and all comments and hopefully follow-up information from fellow members and readers not only on these Tennesseans, but on any and all Confederate Soldiers who were killed at Franklin on that tragic field. All correspondence would be appreciated and answered.

TENNESSEE

Pvt. John H. Ball, (), Co.E. 154th Tennessee. Buried Elmwood Cemetery, Memphis, Shelby County, Tennessee.

Capt. Jeremiah Batts, (23), Co.F. 11th Tennessee, (mw), Died 12-19-64. Buried Batts Family Cemetery, Robertson County, Tennessee. Tombstone reads: "Born Nov 27, 1840--Enlisted in the defense of his country in the Southern Army May 18, 1861 - Was wounded in the Battle of Franklin, Tenn. November 30, 1864 and died of his wound Dec. 9, 1864. His dying request was 'Tell my Mother and Sister that I am one of the few that have tried to serve the Lord and I am not afraid to die.' "

Tombstone photographed and is in very good condition even though it appears to be his original marker. He is buried next to Pvt. R.L. Powell, age 23 of Company F. 11th Tennessee. His stone is also in remarkable condition.

Sgt. John V. Boling, (27), Co.B. 28th Tennessee, (mw&c), Died 4-26-65 Nashville Prison Hospital. Buried Mt. Olivet Cemetery, Confederate Circle, Nashville, Davidson County, Tennessee. (Unmarked).

Sgt. Maj. Robert Bringham, (30), Co.A. 49th Tennessee, (mw), Died 12-7-64. Buried Riverview Cemetery, Clarksville, Montgomery County, Tennessee. "Robert was wounded in the Battle of Peachtree Creek, near Atlanta, July 18, 1864; and, although he had not recovered, he was on crutches and with his command at the time of the carnage at Franklin, having an unexpired furlough in his pocket. Seeing him at the front as his brigade was about starting on a charge, Gen. Quarles advised him to go to the rear, but he declined to retire. He was asked what good he could do on crutches and without a gun. He replied that he could "cheer the boys on" and he did. But he was carried to the hospital the next morning with eight fresh wounds, one of the necessarily fatal, and after six days he died. Sometime afterward his body was reinterred in the family burial-lot at Clarksville, Tennessee. " Robert now sleeps the sleep of heroes in the Riverview Cemetery. Burial stone photographed as marker is in extremely poor condition and barely recognizable.

Pvt. William Howard Cantrell, (23), Co.A. 16th Tennessee, (mw&c), Died 5-5-65 Point Lookout Prison. Buried Prison Confederate Cemetery, Scotland, Maryland, Grave #1666. One of 22 Cantrells who served in this company. Of these, 3 were killed and 2 wounded at Perryville, Kentucky in 1862, and 1 was wounded at Murfreesboro, Tennessee in the winter of 1862. This company was made up from around Smithville, DeKalb County, Tennessee.

Capt. Theodorick Todd Carter, (24), A.D.C. on staff of Gen. T.B. Smith, (mw), Died 12-2-64. Buried Rest Haven Cemetery, Franklin, Williamson County, Tennessee. Received (9) wounds: Multiple wounds in both arms and legs and a mortal head wound over left eye. Mortal wound received 150 yards southwest of the Carter Smokehouse. Capt. Carter died of his wounds in his home among his family who had found him on the battlefield and brought him home. Tombstone photographed and marker appears to be original stone but in need of repair or replacement.

Pvt. Everett Chadwell, (21), Co.B. 24th Tennessee. Buried Chadwell Family Cemetery, Franklin, Williamson County, Tennessee.

Pvt. George W.L. Chriesman, (30), Co.D. 20th Tennessee. Buried Sprott Family Cemetery, Williamson County, Tennessee.

Cpl. Gus H. Crewdson, (), Co.C. 13th Tennessee, (mw), Died _____ Buried Collierville City Cemetery, Collierville, Shelby County, Tennessee.

Pvt. Benjamin W. Dawson, (22), Co.D. 49th Tennessee. Buried Leech Cemetery, Charlotte, Dickson County, Tennessee. His tombstone has the following inscription: "There is a tear for all who die, A Mourner o'er the humblest grave, and nations swell the funeral cry and triumphs weep above the brave".

Pvt. Benjamin John Everett, (38), Co.G. 47th Tennessee, (mw&c), Died 12-2-64. Buried Hill Cemetery, Williamson County, Tennessee.

Pvt. Leonidas Hooper Elliott, (), Co.E. 154th Tennessee, (mw), Died 2-12-65 Columbus, Mississippi Hospital. Buried Elmwood Cemetery, Shelby County, Tennessee.

Lt. Tilford M. Forsee, (41), Co.A. 24th Tennessee Battalion Sharpshooters (Consolidated with 4th Tennessee P.A.) Buried Forsee Family Cemetery, Humphrey County, Tennessee. Killed on the enemy's breastworks. "His sister Martha Forsee Nolan, Squire Travis Slayton, and Big John, a Negro house boy, drove to Franklin for the body--the trip taking three days and nights. They went in an ox-wagon. Billy Slaton, son of the Squire, showed them where the grave was and they found him buried with a comrade, both buried in Tilford's blanket."

Sgt. Maj. Authur Armstrong Fulkerson, (), Co.K. 19th Tennessee. Buried Rest Haven Cemetery, Franklin, Williamson County, Tennessee.

Capt. David Shafe Hay, (), Co.A. 6th Tennessee, (mw), Died _____ Columbia Tennessee Hospital. Buried Rose Hill Cemetery, Confederate Section, Columbia, Maury County, Tennessee. Grave #12.

Sgt. James King, (24), Co.A. 12th Tennessee, (mw&c), Died 1-14-65 Nashville Prison Hospital. Buried Mt. Olivet Cemetery, Confederate Circle, Nashville, Davidson County, Tennessee. (Unmarked).

Capt. Haine Irby Klinck, (30), Co. _____ 154th Tennessee. Buried Elmwood Cemetery, Memphis, Shelby County, Tennessee.

Sgt. Michael Krantz, (25), Co.K. 49th Tennessee, (mw&c), Died 1-9-65 Nashville Prison Hospital. Buried Mt. Olivet Cemetery, Confederate Circle, Nashville, Davidson County, Tennessee. (Unmarked).

Capt. Nicholas H. Lamb, (33), Co.D. 24th Tennessee. Buried Lamb Family Cemetery, Rutherford County, Tennessee.

Capt. Edward F. Lee, A.&I.G. on Gen. Strahl's Staff, (mw), Died _____. Buried Allmond Cemetery, Maury County, Tennessee.

Lt. John T. Marsh, (21), Asst. Inspector General on Gen. Strahl's Staff.
Buried St. John's Churchyard Cemetery, Columbia, Maury County, Tennessee.



THE GALLANT LIEUT. JOHN MARSH,

Lt. Marsh was born in Chatham, North Carolina, but moved with his family to Hardeman County, Tennessee near Bolivar. Through his mother, Lt. Marsh was related to the Perkins family in Middle Tennessee and to the Harstons and Daltons of North Carolina.

Being a cadet at West Point when Tennessee seceded, he resigned and came home to enlist in the Confederate service with the rank of 2nd Lt. in a Tennessee Artillery Battery commanded by Capt. Marsh T. Polk. He saw service at the Battle of Shiloh, and commanding the battery at the Battle of Perryville where he received favorable mention for gallantry. While serving on the Staff of General Preston Smith at the Battle of Chickamauga in September, 1863 he received a serious wound which shattered his left arm. For many months he lay in the hospital at Marietta, Georgia where during this period of suffering he became deeply concerned about religion and through the ministrations of Rev. C.T. Quintard he was led to Christ, and was confirmed by Bishop Elliott in the Marietta Hospital.

Upon his discharge from the hospital. Lt. Marsh visited his widowed mother at the old homestead for the first time since his enlistment. In vain his friends begged him to stay, and his mother pleaded with him not to go back to the front, urging that his injured arm, then shrunken and useless, entitled him to exemption from further service. To all these entreaties he replied: "No, my country needs me now more than ever, and I must go." He reported for duty a short time before the Battle of Atlanta, and was on the Staff of Gen. O.F. Strahl, an old friend from his boyhood, until both laid down their lives at Franklin.

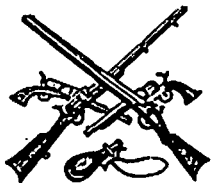

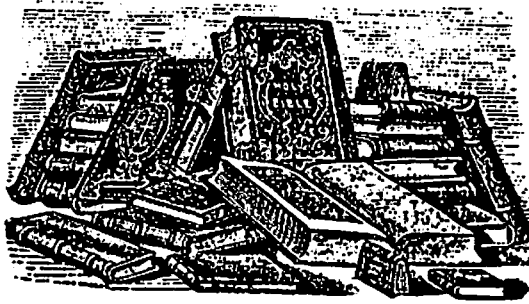

Smith_____ by the Nashville Steam Boat Company and bound from New Orleans to that place, burst her boiler on Monday last a few miles below Eddyville by which 3 persons were killed, 3 missing, supposed to be killed and 4 dangerously injured. Our informant did not understand whether the sufferers were persons belonging to the boat or passengers... Killed: Mrs. Davis of Davidson County; Mrs. _____evrns late of Nashville; Luke Dawson, Esq. of Davidson; a Mr. Hinton and Mrs. Whiteside were missing and of course may be considered among the killed. Mrs. Bess Davidson very much scaled also Henry Bailey of Nashville, Thomas Lane, pilot had his shoulder dislocated and his leg (a wooden one) broke. The boiler burst at the head and done considerable damage to the Bar, cabin, etc.

PENSION PAPERS OF YELVATON NEVILL, PENSION #S4614

(Contributed by Gale Bamman, C. G., Nashville, TN)

Declaration: 12 February 1833, Jackson County, TN....Yelvaton Nevill states that he entered service in that part of ROWAN COUNTY, NC now Rutherford County in November 1780 as a volunteer for 2 years under Capt. Earl and Lt. John CUMMINGS...to scout the country from the line of South Carolina to Mumford's Cave near the head of the Catawba River and guard the frontiers of North Carolina against the Indians and Tories....remained in service until January 1782. Again entered service in Rowan Cty, NC in that part now called Rutherford County in January 1782 as a substitute for John Fisher who was drafted for 3 months...under Capt. Neville, Lt. Cummings....and had another tour in Rutherford County where he then resided in August 1783, being drafted under Col. James Miller and Maj. James Gray.

Yelvaton Nevill states that he was born in Fauquier County, VA 25 December 1763, and that he has lived since the Revolutionary War in Barren County, KY and Jackson Cty, TN where he now lives. Witnessed by James Griffith, clergyman in Jackson county, and Samuel Anderson, both of Jackson County, TN.

Affidavit of Edward Dycus of Jackson Cty, TN, age 82, certifies that he resided in Rowan Cty, NC in years 1780 and 1782...was not acquainted with applicant during the term of service until after the Revolution but was well acquainted with him afterwards. After the Revolution William Nevill was high sheriff of Rutherford County and his son Yelvaton was deputy, and was reputed in that neighborhood to have served in the Revolution. signed: Edward Dycus, 1834.

Deposition of Richard Gordon, resident of Jackson Cty, TN, age 68 last April, certifies that "I resided in Wilkes County, NC in 1780 and that during that year there was a draft of the militia for 12 months". signed 12 May 1834. (Statement to same effect was made also by William Carlisle, resident of Jackson Cty, TN, age 71, a resident of Surry County, NC in year 1780.)
