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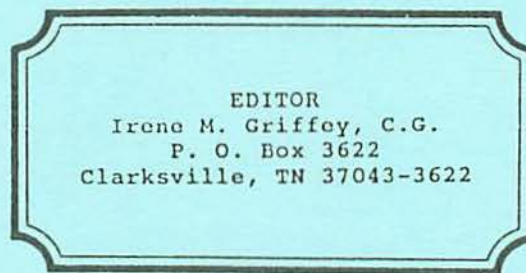

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MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT...



Thanks for your prompt response to our plea in the last newsletter for dues renewal! Archives: Early original records are presently housed in a vault at the Smith County Library, Carthage, TN. In order to preserve the original records, it is requested that the microfilms of these records be consulted. The microfilms are available at the Smith County Public Library.

Missing records: Deed Book A (1799-1801); Marriage records prior to 1838 (only a few survive in the 1838-1845 time period).

Records not microfilmed: Original loose records of Chancery Court. (These presently are being sorted and organized by a volunteer group under the direction of Mr. Ervin Smith, the County Historian, who states that the records will not be ready for microfilming for at least another year.)

GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH IN SUMNER COUNTY, TENNESSEE

You are indeed fortunate if you've traced your ancestry to Sumner County, Tennessee! Not only are the county records almost totally intact from 1786, but much has been collected, published and indexed in Sumner County to ease the task of the genealogist and historian. Those frustrating brick walls, which are found in counties where the records are sparse, shouldn't be present in Sumner County. This article is designed to provide you with a solid genealogical background on the history and resources of Sumner County.

History

Sumner County is a genealogically important county in that its boundaries at its formation in 1786 included land which was later incorporated into the surrounding counties of Wilson, Smith, Macon, Trousdale, and portions of many others.

The area of Sumner County was first explored by long hunters in the 1760's. Attempts at permanent settlements in the late 1770's were discouraged by the ferocity of the Indians. Although the Indian attacks continued through 1795, they did not halt the flow of settlers.

Sumner County was formed as a part of North Carolina on 17 November 1786 from the eastern portion of Davidson County, ten years before Tennessee became a state in 1796. In 1786 Davidson was the only county in Middle Tennessee and thus Sumner is the second oldest county in the middle division and is the fifth county organized within the present bounds of the State of Tennessee. The county was named after Colonel Jethro Sumner, a North Carolina Revolutionary War Soldier, who was not involved in the settlement of the area.

On 25 February 1790 North Carolina passed an act ceding its western lands to the Federal Government and on 25 May 1790 Sumner County became a part of the Territory of the United States South of the River Ohio.

Sumner County includes an area of approximately 500 square miles, much of which remains rural even today. It is bounded on the north by the state of Kentucky, on the east by Macon and Trousdale counties, on the southeast by Wilson County, on the southwest by Davidson County and on the west by Robertson County. The county seat is in Gallatin and the largest city is Hendersonville. Other cities include Castalian Springs, Portland, Westmoreland, White House, Bethpage, and Cairo.

The court records have been preserved by generations of dedicated public servants. There were no courthouse fires; and, although the courthouse was occupied by Federal forces during the Civil War, the records remained unharmed.

On 5 October 1936 a step was taken which led the way to the permanent preservation of Sumner County's treasure load of loose records. The Quarterly Court appointed some of its members to investigate and take action on the construction of

a new courthouse and jail. In January of 1840 T. S. Butt was elected as the County Chairman and a short time later given the responsibility to act as custodian of the courthouse. Thus, the salvation of Sumner's vast collection of original records can be attributed in part to T. S. Butt.

It is assumed that before the new courthouse was dedicated on 1 May 1840, the original court records dating from 1786, which include wills, lawsuits, estates, marriage bonds and many other papers relating to the daily business of the courthouse, were transferred to the Tennessee State Library and Archives for preservation. They remained uncataloged until 1984 when their importance was recognized by the author who led a group of volunteers in reading and indexing the records. They were microfilmed by the State of Tennessee and a computerized index was prepared and published. These records have been accurately described as containing a veritable "goldmine of information." They include complete transcripts of lawsuits from the year 1786 and often tie a grandfather in North Carolina to his children in Sumner County and his grandchildren who have moved on to Arkansas, Missouri, Oklahoma, Texas and other western states. They are available on microfilm at both the Tennessee State Library and Archives in Nashville and the Sumner County Archives in Gallatin, Tennessee. The originals are housed in Gallatin.

Facilities and Resources

The holdings of the Sumner County Courthouse, the Sumner County Archives and the Tennessee State Library and Archives were used to compile a list of records. Although not all records are available at all locations, most can be found at one of the two archival locations. The reader would be wise to exhaust these sources before visiting the courthouse.

The Tennessee State Library and Archives, 403 7th Avenue North, Nashville, Tennessee houses a vast collection of county records on microfilm. You may also wish to consult the published family genealogies, county record books, WPA books, military records and the manuscript collection for family material relating to Sumner County.

The Sumner County Archives was formed in the spring of 1987. It is located at 155 East Main Street in Gallatin, Tennessee and houses a priceless collection of original records. It is open Monday to Friday 8:00 a. m. to 4:30 p.m.

Housed in this facility are the loose records from the courthouse, the original county record books prior to 1940 for Circuit and Chancery Courts as well as many County Court books. An exceptional collection of census records, funeral home records, published family genealogies and county record books, voter registrations, church records, cemetery records, and family material relating to Sumner County awaits the researcher. Three excellent Mormon research tools, the IGI, GLC and Family Registry, are available along with a growing collection of microfilms on various Tennessee counties.

Records - From Date of Origin to 1900 with Missing Years

It is much easier to itemize what is missing in Sumner County than to list the existing records. The most glaring absence of records occurred during the Civil War, a situation not unique to Sumner County. Although the record books exist, no entries were made from 1862 to 1865.

Circuit Court - minutes begin 1789 - missing 1794-1802, 1825.

Chancery Court - minutes begin 1821, missing 1825.

County Court - minutes begin 1787 - none missing.

Settlements and Inventories - begin 1808 - missing 1822-5.

Marriage books - begin 1787 (original 1787-1838 book is missing but a WPA copy is available). The years 1813 and 1814 appear to be missing from the WPA book, and books 1839-44 and 1863-64, 1867 are missing.

Marriage bonds - from 1786 - some missing, but some bonds exist for the years where the books are missing.

Tax records - 1787 - 1884 with some years missing.

Of Special Interest

Most of the holdings of the Sumner County Archives has been indexed by volunteers (including the census 1820-1880): Before devoting hours to searching a record book at the state archives, it would be wise to determine whether that particular book has been indexed at the county archives.

A computerized listing of marriages in alphabetical order by the surname of the bride and groom from 1786 to the present time is available in the courthouse and the Sumner County Archives. In addition, the county archives has some early vital records which have not yet been microfilmed and are thus not available at the Tennessee State Library and Archives. These include births for the years 1881-1882, 1908-1912, 1925-1936, 1933-1939 and deaths for 1881-1882, 1925-1939, and 1938.

Obtaining the Records

If you are able to visit either of these facilities, you should be able to make excellent progress on your family history. If not, two options are available to you.

Both facilities will respond to mail requests for a specific record. The Sumner County Archives is non funded and an SASE is required in order to obtain a response.

Your second option, and the only one if extensive research is necessary, is to hire a professional researcher. Both facilities will provide you with a list of researchers upon request with an SASE. Neither will accept responsibility for the quality of workmanship of those listed. As in any profession, some are competent and some are not. It is always wise to ascertain prices before hiring researchers.

MEMBERSHIP LIST OF THE SILOAM MISSIONARY BAPTIST CHURCH

Genealogists searching in Macon County, Tennessee for their kin are especially challenged because three courthouse fires destroyed most of the original records dating before 1901. For that reason, privately held records are especially valuable.

Founded in 1842, the Siloam Missionary Baptist Church is located in northwestern Macon County, about two miles from the Sumner County line on State Highway 52. Church clerks kept records of the church's business meetings which give fascinating detail about the lives of the ordinary people, especially their relationship to their community and their religion.

The membership list below gives the names of those who joined the church between its constitution in 1842 and the first revision of the membership list. A committee to make the revision was appointed in October 1864 because many of the sisters had married, changing their names.

This list, consisting of five pages in the original manuscript, contains entries in the handwriting of each of the four clerks who served Siloam Church between 1842 and 1883. The left side of the page, where the names of the members are listed, contains handwriting by only Taylor G. Gilliam and John Smothers, the first two clerks. (Smothers was clerk at the time of the 1864 revision.) Entries to the right, however, contain the handwriting of all the clerks. On the first page of names only, Clerk Taylor Gilliam has included parallel columns to indicate whether the member joined by letter or by experience (profession of faith). Asterisks are used below to give that information. One asterisk means "joined by letter"; two means "joined by experience." Gilliam did not include the nineteen constituting members, since they all joined by letter from Testament Church, the "mother" of the Siloam congregation.

Spelling, capitalization, punctuation, and other similar features are preserved just as they appear in the original document. Square brackets indicate an illegible word or words, with the relative length of the bracket indicating the approximate number of letters. If letters appear inside the brackets, they indicate a conjectural reading for missing letters. The addition of a question mark inside the brackets indicates doubt about the conjecture.

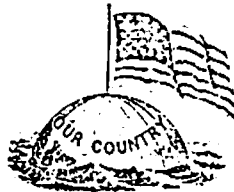

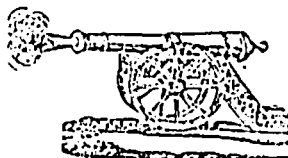
William Rutherford a resident of Clarksville, TN, with his attorney R. W. Humphries filed his intention to be come a US citizen.

"To the Hon. County Court of Montgomery County sitting at Clarksville affiant William Rutherford states that on the 7th day of June 1850, he landed at the City of New York; that previous to that time he was a native born subject to the Kingdom of Great Britain and he emigrated to the Country for the purpose of residing here. Affiant states that he is not twenty eight years old. Affiant states that he emigrated to the State of Tennessee in February 1851 with the intention of becoming a citizen of said state. Affiant states that he now solemnly renounces all allegiance to all foreign powers Kingdoms and pricipalities and I especially renounce forever my allegiance to Victoria Queen of the Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland. Affiant states that it is his bona fide determination to become a Citizen of the United States of America and to acquire all the rights and _____ and franchises of a naturalized citizen and to this end he files this his declaration and he hereby solemnly renounces all titles of nobility and all _____ titles conferred by any and every foreign government whatever." Signed: William Rutherford. Sworn to and subscribed before William Rogers, Clerk this 22 day of July 1852.

ALABAMA SOLDIERS KILLED AT THE BATTLE OF FRANKLIN

November 30, 1864

Tim Burgess is a Member of the Board and Chairman of the Publications Committee of the Middle Tennessee Genealogical Society. His occupation is Investigator II with The Tennessee Department of Commerce and Insurance.

A portion of the research material he is preparing for publication of Sealed with Blood - Honored Graves - The Battle of Franklin Death Roster addresses the distant burials of Confederate soldiers. The term distant refers to their remains not being buried in the Carnton Confederate Cemetery in Franklin, Tennessee, where sleep 1,481 of the 1,739 Confederate soldiers killed or mortally wounded at the Battle of Franklin fought on November 30, 1864.

Tim welcomes any and all comments or follow-up information from fellow MTGS members and readers on any and all Confederate soldiers who were killed on that tragic field in Franklin, Tennessee. All correspondence is appreciated and a response will be made promptly.

A listing of twenty-two Alabama soldiers identified at this time follows with some personal history or information of them or their burial.

ALABAMA

Pvt. William Harper Ard, (), Co.B. 33rd Alabama (mw&c), Died January 1865. Buried Betner Cemetery, Daleville, Dale County, Alabama. (Unmarked)

Lt. Col. Edward Herbert Armistead, (25), 22nd Alabama (mw), Died 12-7-1864. Col. Armistead received his preliminary education in Montgomery, but before he was ready for college, the War broke out. He enlisted in the 22nd Alabama, was elected Lieutenant, was appointed Captain and Assistant Commissary of subsistence, November 1, 1861, and resigned February 11, 1862 after having been elected Captain of Company D on January 11, 1862.

He was promoted to Major on February 11, 1864, and was wounded so severely that he died less than a week later. His commission as Lt. Col. was authorized by the C.S.A. War Department on January 19, 1865. He was a member of the Protestant Episcopal Church, and was unmarried.

Originally buried in Mt. Hope Cemetery, Franklin, Tennessee. Disinterred after the War and buried in Oakwood Cemetery, Montgomery, Montgomery County, Alabama.

Pvt. J. Bailey, (29), Co.E. 35th Alabama, (mw&c), Died 1-28-65. Pvt. Bailey was admitted to a Union Hospital in Nashville on December 1, 1864 and on that day his left leg was amputated. He lingered until dying of exhaustion on January 28, 1865.

Buried Mt. Olivet Cemetery, Confederate Circle, Nashville, Davidson County, Tennessee. (Unmarked)

Capt. William Owen Baldwin, Jr., (19), Co.G. 22nd Alabama. Capt. Baldwin was born on either November 21, 1844, or November 23, 1845. He enrolled in the University of Alabama in 1862. He left the University shortly afterwards and enlisted as a private in Capt. C.P. Storr's Company of Alabama Cavalry. He was appointed Sgt. Maj. of the 22nd Alabama, and later elected Lt. and then Captain of Co.G; all before he was eighteen years old. He was known as the "boy Captain" of Dea's Alabama Brigade.

Buried Oakwood Cemetery, Montgomery, Montgomery County, Alabama.

Lt. James W. Cawthorn, (), Co.K. 29th Alabama, (mw) and Died January, 1865 in a hospital in Uniontown, Alabama. Lt. Cawthorn enlisted at Clayton, Barbour County, Alabama on March 10, 1862 and was promoted to 5th Sergeant June 1, 1862. He was wounded in the hand at New Hope Church, Georgia on May 29, 1864. On November 9, 1864 he was promoted to 2nd Lieutenant and was wounded at Franklin, Tennessee. On December 26, 1864 he was listed as a patient at Officers Hospital, Uniontown, Alabama where he is presumed to have died of his wound.

He is buried in Uniontown, Perry County, Alabama.

Capt. John S. Dickson, (42), Co.E. 35th Alabama.

Buried in Maple Hill Cemetery, Huntsville, Madison County, Alabama.

Pvt. Alford E. Green, (36), Co.K. 29th Alabama (mw), Died January, 1865. Pvt. Green of Pike County, Alabama enlisted March 10, 1862 at Clayton, Alabama. He was listed as a patient at May Hospital, Meridian, Mississippi suffering from a wound received at Franklin, Tennessee on November 30, 1864. He died in January, 1865 and is buried in Meridian, Lauderdale County, Mississippi.

Pvt. Moses J. Harrison, (20), Co.C. 17th Alabama.

Buried in Harrison Family Cemetery, Butler County, Alabama.

Pvt. Doctor Clifton Key, (), Co. L. 28th Alabama (mw&c), Died February 14, 1865 at Camp Douglas Prison, Illinois.

Buried Confederate Burial Mound, Oakwoods Cemetery, Chicago, Cook County, Illinois.

Capt. William H. Lindsey, (24), Co.I. 26th Alabama, (mw&c), Died March 11, 1865. Capt. Lindsey was severely wounded and captured on November 30, 1864 and had an arm amputated the same night. He was released from a Nashville Union Prison Hospital and sent to the Provost Marshall February 8, 1865. He was imprisoned at Camp Chase Prison where he died from his wounds.

He is buried in the prison cemetery, Columbus, Franklin County, Ohio. Row 34, Grave 65, Stone # 1620.

Pvt. John Loid, (), Co.C. 29th Alabama, (mw), Died January 1865. Pvt. Loid enlisted September 23, 1861 at Blountsville, Alabama and was sick most of March and April, 1863 and was in the hospital most of May and June, 1863. He was seriously wounded at Franklin, Tennessee on November 30, 1864 and was reported as a patient at St. Mary's Hospital, West Point, Mississippi in January, 1865 where he died of his wounds.

He was buried in the West Point Cemetery, Clay County, Mississippi.

Sgt. Dutton T. McAnnally, (), Co.C. 29th Alabama, (mw), Died January, 1865. Sgt. McAnnally enlisted September 23, 1861 at Blountsville, Alabama. He was promoted to Corporal September 28, 1862, and later to First Sergeant. He was listed as a patient in St. Mary's Hospital in West Point, Mississippi in January, 1865 where he died of his wounds.

He is buried in the City Cemetery in West Point, Clay County, Mississippi.

Pvt. James A. Milan, (), Co.B. 16th Alabama, (mw) and Died January, 1865. Pvt. Milan was removed from the battlefield and was admitted to a Confederate Hospital in Columbia, Tennessee where he died of his wounds in January, 1865.

Buried in Rose Hill Cemetery, Confederate Section, Columbia, Maury County, Tennessee, Grave # 58.

Pvt. Robert P. Owens, (), Co.B. 17th Alabama, (mw), Died _____. Pvt. Owens was taken from the battlefield and admitted to a Confederate Hospital in Columbia, Tennessee where he died from his wounds.

He is buried in Rose Hill Cemetery, Confederate Section, Columbia, Maury County, Tennessee, Grave #55.

Capt. Orlando Stutts Palmer, (), A.A.G. General Lowery's Brigade Staff, (mw&c), Died January 19, 1865. He had previously been wounded at Shiloh and took conspicuous and gallant part in every battle of the Army of Tennessee. He was removed from the battlefield and admitted to a Confederate Hospital in Columbia, Tennessee where he died of his wounds.

Originally buried in Rose Hill Cemetery, Columbia, Tennessee he was reinterred after the war in the Kennedy-Stutts Family Cemetery, Greenhill, Lauderdale County, Alabama.

Sgt. Thomas Washington Peebles, (19), Co.B. 35th Alabama, (mw), Died December 1, 1864. Sgt. Peebles had previously just professed his deep religious beliefs and had joined many others of his regiment in forming a Christian Organization within his brigade. Sgt. Peebles was disinterred from Franklin after the war and buried in the Peebles Family Cemetery, Jackson County, Alabama.

Pvt. Charles H. Pritchard, (), Co.D. 1st Alabama, Died December 26, 1864. Pvt. Pritchard was removed from a Confederate Hospital in Franklin when the Union Forces reoccupied this town on December 17, 1864. He was admitted to a Union Prison Hospital in Nashville and died from his wounds. He is buried in Mt. Olivet Cemetery, Confederate Circle, Nashville, Davidson County, Tennessee.

Pvt. Martin Riley, (), Co.A. 29th Alabama, (mw), Died January 2, 1865. Pvt. Riley enlisted at Shelby Springs, Alabama on September 12, 1861. Having been wounded on November 30, 1864 he bravely stayed with his command until he was admitted to a Confederate Hospital during the retreat from Tennessee in December, 1864. He died of his wounds in a hospital in Corinth, Mississippi and is buried in the Confederate Cemetery, Corinth, Alcorn County, Mississippi. (Unmarked.)

Asst. Surg. Dr. Fielding Pope Sloan, (32), 50th Alabama, (mw&c), Died June 19, 1865. Dr. Sloan was born April 7, 1833 in the Ocoee section of Polk County, Tennessee of Scotch-Irish parents. His early life was spent on the farm, with poor school advantages having nine brothers and one sister. However through hard work and study he was educated at Maryville College, and took his degree in medicine at the University of Nashville in March, 1860. He immediately started practice at Spring Place, Georgia. At the outbreak of the war he enlisted in the 11th Georgia Infantry. On a march from Winchester to Bull Run, Virginia he developed rheumatism which settled in his ankle and so disabled him that he was discharged. He at once assisted in raising a company of cavalry and was elected Third Lieutenant of Company D., 5th Tennessee Cavalry. In passing through Knoxville, Tennessee he met Dr. Frank A. Ramsey, who told him he had been hunting for him.

He was needed in the medical department, and at once had him transferred and assigned to College Hill Hospital, Knoxville, Tennessee. Some time afterwards Dr. Sloan was sent to Kingston, Tennessee to establish a hospital there. Upon the evacuation of East Tennessee in late 1863 he moved his hospital to Griffin, Georgia. During the Dalton and Atlanta, Georgia campaigns of 1864 he was assigned to the 50th Alabama Infantry under the command of Col. John G. Coltart.

In the bloody Battle of Franklin all of his litter bearers having been shot down, he went on the battleline to look after the wounded and was shot through the right elbow. Turning to leave the field, he was shot through the left lung and after laying upon the battlefield throughout the night was found the next day amid thousands of wounded men and taken to the home of Dr. John B. McEwen where he died of his wounds on June 19, 1865. In the family Bible his father wrote: Dr. Fielding Pope Sloan died at Franklin, Tennessee on Monday morning June 19th, 1865 from wounds received at the battle of November 30, while engaged alone in the night administering to the wounded and dying. Age, thirty two years, two months, and twelve days. Dr. Sloan is buried in Rest Haven Cemetery, Franklin, Williamson County, Tennessee.

Pvt. Powell Smith, (35), Co.G. 25th Alabama, (mw&c), Died February 15, 1865. Pvt. Smith was treated on the field until captured and admitted to Union Hospital Number 1 in Nashville, Tennessee in December, 1864. Union Surgeon B.B. Breed reported: "Gunshot flesh wound on the inner and posterior aspect of the right natis. On February 9, 1865, hemorrhage occurred from the internal pudic artery to the extent of six ounces; this was arrested by the application of persulphate of iron. On the morning of the 15th, hemorrhage reoccurred and, patient being extensively reduced, it proved fatal before it could be arrested. The case was under the care of Acting Assistant Surgeon W.J.R. Holmes."

Pvt. Smith is buried in Mt. Olivet Cemetery, Confederate Section, Nashville, Davidson County, Tennessee.

Ensign Robert John Wheeler, (), Co.B. 35th Alabama. Ensign Wheeler had only recently professed his deep Christian beliefs in his religion along with many others of his Regiment and Brigade. Family history says he was a flag bearer and was wrapped in his Regiment's flag and brought back home for burial in the Tusculum City Cemetery, Colbert County, Alabama.

Lt. (Adjutant) Bryce Alexander Wilson, Jr., (27), 16th Alabama. Lt. Wilson was the last adjutant of his regiment. He was the son of Bryce Wilson, Sr., of Russellville, Alabama. He had previously been in the 9th Mississippi Infantry Regiment and transferred to the 16th Alabama while stationed at Tupelo, Mississippi in the summer of 1863. His commander, Lt. Col. J.W. Harris stated "Bryce was a fine adjutant and very rigid. There was no braver man in the Army." He was killed simultaneously with Col. Frederick Ashford of the 16th Alabama. Strangely, Bryce had a premonition of his death when he was warned in a dream on the night before the battle.

A student of Bethany College, Virginia, he had begun the practice of law at Hernando, Mississippi before the war. After the War, his father had his remains and those of his brother William (a private in the 27th Alabama who died in a Union prison at Camp Douglas, Illinois) brought home and both are buried side by side beneath the sod of their native valley in the Wilson Family Cemetery, Russellville, Franklin County, Alabama.

Columns on the schedules are, in order, males 0-5, males 5-10, males 10-15, males 15-20, males 20-30, males 30-40, males 40-50, males 50-60, males 60-70, males 70-80, males 80-90, males 90-100, males over 100. To the right of these are 13 identical columns for females.

A household with figures as follows:

120001-103001001

means it was composed of 1 male under 5; 2 males 5-10 and 1 male 30-40; 1 female under 5; 3 females 10-15; 1 female 30-40 and 1 female 60-70.

QUESTION: Charles and Joyce Lovelady R #1 Box 461, Dover, TN 37058, publishers of Hornberger Journal ask "Where were the ports of Cowes and Deal?"

ANSWER: The seaport Deal is located on the east coast of Kent, England, at the north entrance into the Strait of Dover. The Strait of Dover is a narrow channel 21 miles wide with an average depth of less than 100 feet. It separates England and France and connects the North Sea with the English Channel. Deal has a natural harbour referred to as the Downs. Henry VIII built three castles in Deal in 1539. In 1682, William Penn sailed from Deal on his first voyage to America.

Two seaports in the English Channel (which separates France and England) are named East Cowes and West Cowes. They are separated by the river Medina. Today, the major seaport of Southampton lies between the two towns. The Mayflower sailed from Southampton. Henry VIII built Cowes Castle in 1540 for coastal defence. During World War II, Cowes was heavily bombed because of its ship building and munition works.

The waters of the North Sea and the Atlantic Ocean meet in the English Channel. The currents of the two seas and frequent windstorms cause the waters of the English Channel to be very turbulent at times. When the rough waters detained the ships leaving Rotterdam, they would wait it out in the ports of Deal and Cowes. Also, supplies were taken on at both ports.

Thus, "...from Rotterdam last from Cowes" or "...from Rotterdam last from Deal" would mean ships originating first at Rotterdam had spent some time in the ports of Cowes or Deal either to take on supplies or to "wait out" the rough water of the English Channel.
