NATIONAL SOCIETY COLONIAL DAMES XVII CENTURY

The National Society was organized July 1915 by Florence Taney during the meeting of the International Genealogical Congress at the Panama Exposition. The goals were to aid in the establishment of a College of Heraldry in the United States, the founding of chairs of historical search in colleges and universities, award of scholarships to the nation's youth and commemoration of the heroic deeds of the founders of the Republic. It is hope of the Society members that their activities will inspire men and women to follow the most commendable example of the founders of the United States.

As second largest patriotic society in the U. S., the organization observed its seventy-fifth year in 1990 with a Diamond Celebration in Washington, D.C. Culminating the observance was a Tea at the White House, hosted by First Lady, Barbara Bush.

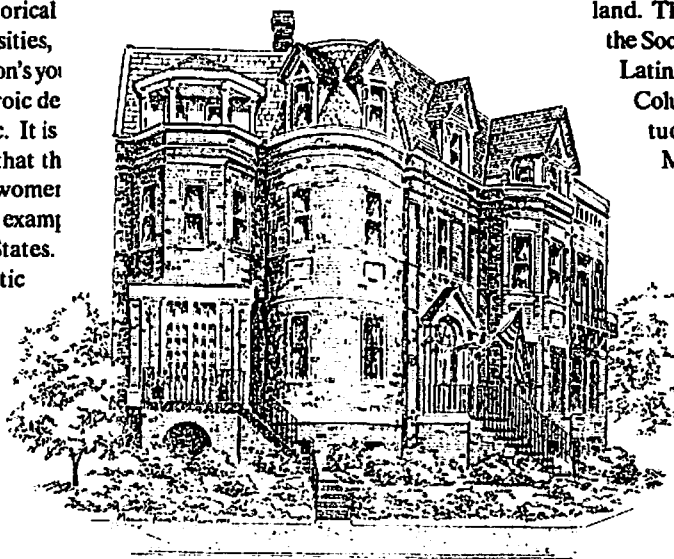
The Society is headquartered in an architecturally important brownstone mansion at 1300 New Hampshire Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C.

The building was purchased by the Colonial Dames XVII Century in 1957 from the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States. The Headquarters building houses a genealogical and heraldic library, museum, historic documents, and other data pertinent to the seventeenth century.

The National Bylaws, Article III, Sections, 1, 2, 3, and 4, and Article IV, state: "Any American woman of good moral character, eighteen years of age or over, is eligible for membership, provided she has been invited by the Society and is the lineal descendant of an ancestor who lived and served prior to 1701 in one of the Original Colonies in the geographic area of the present United States of America.

Documentary proof of an ancestor's service prior to 1701 in one of the follow-

ing is required: Historic Founder of Jamestown and Historic Founder of any of the original colonies; Member of the London, Plymouth and Virginia Companies who came to the colonies to live; Colonial Governor, Lieutenant Governor,

Deputy Governor, or Colonial Officer; Member of the House of Burgesses; Member or Delegate to the Council of the Assembly; Deputy or Representative to the General Court; Founder or Trustee of any College or School; Minister of the Gospel or Commissary of the Bishops of London; Member of the Council of Safety of 1689; Signer of the Mayflower Compact; Member of the House of Deputies; or six other services as detailed in the National Bylaws.

Scholarships funded by members include the Colonial Dames XVII Century Pocahontas Scholarships for American Indians. Represented are young people studying in the fields of nursing, dental hygiene, radiology, pharmacology, dentistry, and pre-med. Tribes represented in the past year include Choctaw, Peoria,

Navajo, Powhatan, Cherokee, Fox, Seminole, Washoe, Jicarilla Apache, Choctaw, Chickasaw, Creek, Blackfoot, Sioux, and Pit River. The Pocahontas Project Fund also includes the upkeep of the Pocahontas Memorial Gardens in Gravesend, England. The General Scholarships Fund of the Society include awards to the Roxbury Latin School, University of District of Columbia, Alice Lloyd School in Kentucky, The College of William and Mary, and approximately twenty other schools during a given year.

Through the efforts of its members, a number of colonial sites have been marked and information gathered for preservation of these and other historic sites. Members are active in veteran's service, committees are maintained to enlighten the society on issues of national defense, and numerous Colonial Dames XVII Century members are active in heraldry or colonial research.

There are presently two chapters in Middle Tennessee, the Clarendon Chapter of Franklin, formed in 1960, and the Thomas Lygon Chapter of Nashville, organized in 1986. Through this organization, many enthusiastic members have formed warm friendships while working toward a better America.

Mrs. J. Leith Potter, in addition to being Honorary State President, is currently serving her second term as State President, is past National Chaplain General, past Organizing Secretary General, has held three national chairmanships, and is organizing president of the Thomas Lygon Chapter in Nashville.

"SPRING HAVEN" The History of a Home

Majestic "Spring Haven" stands today at the end of Carrington Road in Hendersonville, Sumner County, Tennessee, a large two-story, ante-bellum home, built in the Federal style of architecture. A stone fence and tall shrubs protect the old home from the rapid encroachment of modern society in the form of apartments, housing developments and retail establishments. All that remains of the original 640 acre tract of land, granted in the year 1786, is 3.1 acres.

Tracing the ownership of the land from that first pioneer settler in 1786 to the current owner has been a learning experience which has reenforced a long held belief that land and tax records are critically important to the solution of genealogical problems.

Records in the Southeastern United States

This is particularly true in 17th and 18th century research in the southeastern United States, where early census records, vital records and thorough church records are often lacking.

The loss of courthouse records due to Civil War and fires in Tennessee and other southern states is sometimes alleviated by the survival of deeds. When one considers the vast amount of problems which would be created by the loss of the land records, it is easy to understand that if there is time to rescue anything at all from a burning courthouse, it will be the deeds. Because of this, southern researchers sometimes find themselves relying heavily on deeds. Occasionally, tax lists also survived, because they were generated and/or preserved at the state level.

A Brief History of the Area

To understand the history of "Spring Haven," it is necessary to know something of the history of the state and the county. Tennessee was settled in a somewhat unique manner. The eastern counties were the first ones formed and then settlers came overland and by the Cumberland River to French Lick (now known as Nashville) in Middle Tennessee. Settlement expanded from this center, known as the Cumberland Settlements, and the area between it and the eastern counties remained a wilderness for many years.

Much of the land in Sumner County, Tennessee was settled by preemption grants of 640 acres, made available to settlers who were in the Cumberland area by 1 June 1780. In addition, Sumner County was part of the Military District, established so that North Carolina's Revolution-

ary soldiers could realize claims to land, which had been paid to them in land warrants for their Revolutionary War service. Many sold their warrants while others came to Tennessee to claim their land. Other settlers purchased grants of land.

Sumner County, Tennessee was the second county organized in Middle Tennessee and many of the counties surrounding it today were formed from land that was located in Sumner County in 1786. It is blessed with excellent records. There has never been any major destruction of records. Its collection of loose court records is truly superior. Most of its records are extant from 17 November 1786 when it was formed from Davidson County, then a part of North Carolina.

Solutions Sometimes Impossible

Even with all of these resources available, it wasn't possible to resolve all of the questions about "Spring Haven." Although the deeds relating to the home were examined, most conveyed the land and contained no reference to the house itself. Even by combining the deeds with tax lists and comparing the prices paid for the various tracts of land, it was not possible to determine that a structure as well as land was being conveyed. Thus, it was impossible to pinpoint the date of construction from these records.

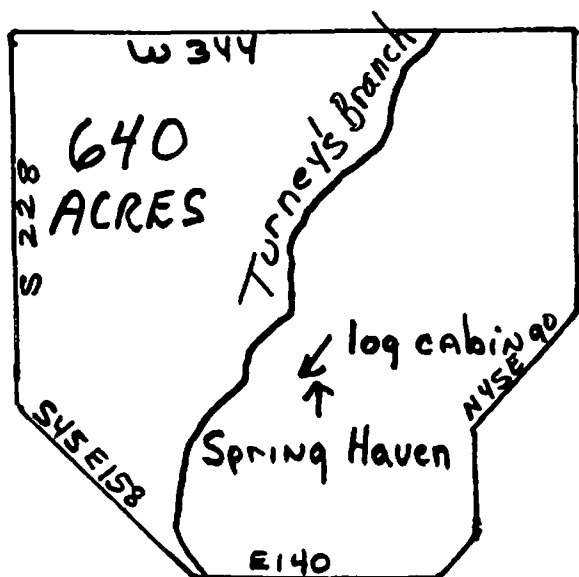
The House and Grounds

On the grounds of the property, a short distance from the main house is a log cabin, which was probably built around 1800. The house itself was constructed of pit sawn lumber and originally had three rooms downstairs and three upstairs. Since a water driven circular saw was advertised for use in the area in 1828, it seems likely that such a saw would have been used had it been available. Thus, it appears that the house was constructed prior to that year. It is believed that both the cabin and the house were built in stages with many additions and changes over the years. A smoke house and slave kitchen, located thirty feet from the original house, were later connected to the main house. A large porch was added at some point and later converted to a den and kitchen. There is also a large, beautiful barn that is believed to have been constructed around the turn of the century.

Many of the old homes built in Sumner County in the 1800's have remained in the same family generation after generation, with ownership vested today in descendants of

the original settler. "Spring Haven" has had more than twenty different owners, many unrelated to each other, who have contributed to the development of the home. While the chain of ownership has been established, many relationships remain unexplored in the web of surnames surrounding the ownership of the home.

The name of the home "Spring Haven" developed some time after 1920. Earlier, the house was known as "Brook Haven" and before that "Hard Times." What fascinating tales "Spring Haven" could tell us about the various families who have lived there over the years!

Henry Turney

The history of "Spring Haven" begins with Henry Turney, an early settler in Middle Tennessee. Although he received a preemption grant of 640 acres of land on the south side of the Harpeth River for his services in settling the area,¹ it was not the land on which "Spring Haven" was constructed.

The original 640 acre tract of land, where "Spring Haven" was later built, was a purchase grant executed to Henry Turney in Davidson County, North Carolina (now Tennessee) on 17 April 1786.² The land was located on both sides of Turney's Branch on the north side of the Cumberland River. When Sumner County was formed a few months later, this land fell into the new county. Although Henry Turney owned the entire 640 acres of land from 1786 to 1797, he was not taxed on it in Sumner County and apparently never lived on it. Henry's only contribution to the history of the land was that his surname was retained on the stream that meanders gently through the property.³

On 17 November 1797 Henry Turney was of Hawkins County, Tennessee when he sold 240 acres of the 640 acre tract to John Looney⁴ and another 200 acres to John Barnes.⁵ On 5 October 1801 he conveyed the remaining 200 acres to Edward Sanders.⁶ Henry Turney eventually settled in Smith County, Tennessee and died in 1843 in DeKalb County, Tennessee.⁷

Edward and Lockey (Trigg) Sanders

Edward Sanders was born about 1774, the son of Thomas and Mary (Mitchell) Sanders.⁸ He may have had a first wife named Mary Donnell, although the marriage date is unknown.⁹ On 26 April 1800 Edward Sanders married Lockey Trigg in Sumner County with Will Trigg serving as bondsman.¹⁰

Shortly after their marriage, on 13 December 1800 Edward purchased 240 acres of the 640 acre Turney tract from John Looney.¹¹ This was the portion where "Spring Haven" was to be constructed and it seems likely that Edward purchased this land with the intention of making a home for his new bride. While it is believed that Edward Sanders built the log cabin that is on the grounds of

"Spring Haven," no proof of this exists. On 5 October 1801 he purchased an additional 200 acres of the Turney tract directly from Henry Turney.¹²

Edward purchased other tracts of land. On 13 December 1801 he bought 255 acres of land from Peter Hansborough of Shelby County, Kentucky, which was located on the north side of the Cumberland River and west of the Turney tract.¹³

On 6 December 1806 Edward purchased the remaining 200 acres of the 640 acre Turney tract from John Barnes,¹⁴ thus restoring the property to its original size and shape. In 1812 Edward purchased an additional 100 acres of land from Michael Black,¹⁵ giving him a total of 995 acres. In 1816 Edward was taxed on 995 acres "whereon he lives" and 12 slaves.

A change took place about the year 1817. In that year Edward was taxed on 370 acres "where he lived," 640 acres on Turney's Branch and 355 acres on the Cumberland River and 16 slaves. This tax list indicates that Edward had purchased an additional 370 acre tract of land in the ensuing year and was living on it. Although the deed for this land wasn't recorded until 1829, after Edward's death, it has been established that he purchased it in his lifetime.¹⁶ In 1818 and 1819 his tax listing was identical, with a total acreage of 1365. Assuming the tax lists are accurate, Edward never lived on the 640 acre Turney grant after he purchased the 370 acre tract in 1816.

Edward wrote his will on 29 May 1819 and it was probated in Sumner County in November of 1819.¹⁷ It named his wife Locky and specified that the estate remain together for the schooling of the children and then to be divided equally among his children. It indicated that he intended to give, or had already given, his daughter Polly Wagon some real estate. His wife was to receive 200 acres including the house for her life or widowhood. At her death or remarriage, the estate was to be immediately divided.

His widow Locky was enumerated as head of household in the 1820 census of Sumner County.¹⁸ She was taxed on the same land holdings as Edward had been taxed on in 1819, but with 18 slaves. On 5 July 1821 the executors of Edward's estate conveyed 130 acres of land (which was later determined to be the land where the cabin and "Spring Haven" were located) to John P. Wagon for \$1250 to pay the debts on the estate.¹⁹

The sale of this land is reflected in the 1821 and 1822 tax lists with Locky taxed on only 1100 acres of land. The original 1365 minus 130 leaves 1235 acres. If the additional 143 acres that Polly Wagon received in the division of his estate is deducted, the taxable acreage is within 8 acres of being accurate.

On 30 November 1822 a deed of partition was executed, dividing the lands of Edward Sanders among his children.²⁰ 1129 acres were divided among the widow and eight children. Locky received 200 acres on both sides of Drakes Creek including Henderson Mill. This was,

according to a lawsuit filed later, the tract where Edward was living when he died.

Locky was also present in the 1830 census of Sumner County.²¹ On 18 September 1835, some of the heirs of Edward Sanders, along with his widow Locky, petitioned the Sumner County Court to sell some land in order to purchase better land in West Tennessee or Mississippi.²² This land was surveyed on 23 October 1835 and the tract contained 380 acres of land, including the place called Hendersonville (now a bedroom community to Nashville and a thriving metropolis of 32,000 people).²³ On 28 December 1836 Locky was "of Shelby County" when she gave her son-in-law John P. Wagon power of attorney to complete the sale of this land.²⁴ In October of 1837 the heirs filed a lawsuit in Sumner County in an attempt to regain the land of their deceased sister Elizabeth.²⁵ Nothing further was learned about Locky and she is presumed to have died in Shelby County. Children of Edward and Locky (Trigg) Sanders, as documented in the will and lawsuit:

John P. and Mary "Polly" (Sanders) Wagon

John P. Wagon was born 8 November 1798.²⁸ He married Mary "Polly" Mosley Sanders on 5 November 1818 in Sumner County.²⁹ Polly was born 5 December 1801³⁰ in Sumner County, Tennessee, the daughter of Edward and Locky (Trigg) Sanders.³¹ The 1819 will of Polly's father Edward Sanders indicated that "whatever I have given to my daughter Polly Wagon shall be taken into view in the division and shall be considered as so much of her part of my estate." While it was at first believed that Edward gave his daughter the land with the cabin, plats later proved otherwise. John and Polly were not in the 1820 census in their own household. Polly's widowed mother Locky was enumerated as head of a large household in Sumner County and perhaps John and Polly were living with her.

John P. Wagon does not appear on the tax lists until 1821 and it was in 1821 that John purchased the 130 acres belonging to the estate of his wife's father. This was the land where the cabin was located and where "Spring Haven" was later constructed. He was taxed that year on 273 acres "whereon he lives." His wife Polly had received 143 acres in the division of her father's estate. This 143 acres combined with the 130 acre purchase resulted in a combined tract of 273 acres. John and Polly probably lived in the cabin, which is believed to have been built by Polly's father, while they began the construction of "Spring Haven".

In 1822 John P. Wagon was taxed on 298 acres "whereon he lives" and he had acquired seven slaves. This acreage is apparently an error. It was never repeated and there is no explanation for it.

On 4 February 1830 John P. Wagon purchased 65 1/2 acres of land on the waters of Turney's Branch from Thomas Sanders for \$655,³² apparently a portion of the 140 acres of land that Thomas received in the division of his father's estate.

Wagon's land holdings at this point should have been about 338 1/2 acres. On 23 December 1835 John and Polly executed a deed to John B. Pittman for this land, calling it 339 1/2 acres.³³ However, it was necessary for John Pittman to file a lawsuit in 1838, in order to obtain clear title to this land.³⁴ John and Polly moved to Shelby County, Tennessee by 1839, about the same time that Polly's widowed mother Lockey moved there. On 1 March 1839 John P. Wagon and his wife Mary of Shelby County, Tennessee executed a second deed to John B. Pittman of Sumner for two tracts of land which totalled 339 1/2 acres for \$5000.³⁵ The first tract of 65 1/2 acres had been purchased from Thomas Sanders. The second tract was the remaining 274 acres. In this deed the land is identified as where "Edward Sanders formerly lived." Since Sander's died on the Drake's Creek land, this deed conclusively proves that he once lived on the Turney tract.

Polly's signature on the deed is significant. Women in Tennessee in that time frame had dower interest only in land that their husband owned at his death. A wife's name on a deed indicates an interest in the land, often through an inheritance from her father.

John P. Wagon received \$5000 for his land and there is little doubt that he owned the land when the original six room structure, which was later known as "Spring Haven," was built.

John B. and Rebecca (Moore) Pittman

John B. Pittman was born in Tennessee in 1804, the son of William Pittman. William wrote his will in Sumner County on 26 September 1826, naming his son John B.³⁶

John B. Pittman married Rebecca Moore about 1830, although their marriage was not recorded in Sumner County.

Rebecca was born in Tennessee in 1803, the daughter of Susan Moore.³⁷ In December of 1834 John and his partner Charles Grandison Sanders were involved in a lawsuit. While on the surface it would appear that John B. Pittman had no connection to the previous property owners, John's business partner was the son of James Sanders and nephew of Edward Sanders, a previous owner of the property.³⁸

On 1 March 1839 John received clear title to the two separate tracts of land where "Spring Haven" was located. The Pittmans were enumerated in the 1840 census of Sumner County with two young females in their household.³⁹

The will of John's mother-in-law Susan Moore was probated in Sumner County in April of 1848 and named her daughter Rebecca L. Pittman. Ten years after purchasing "Spring Haven" on 19 May 1849 John B. Pittman sold these two tracts of land totalling 339 1/2 acres to John Armfield.⁴⁰

On 19 May 1849 Rebecca Pittman, wife of John B. Pittman executed a quitclaim relinquishing her interest in this land.⁴¹ Rebecca's mother Susan Moore's will devised to her daughter Rebecca Pitman and husband John B. Pittman money due from Alfred Moore. This money came from a deed of trust executed by John B. Pittman to Alfred Moore. This legacy vested in Rebecca an interest in "Spring Haven" and thus her quitclaim was necessary to provide clear title.

John and Rebecca were enumerated in the 1850 census of Wilson County, Tennessee.⁴² Whether John and Rebecca added to the home that was later known as "Spring Haven" is unknown. Children of John and Rebecca (Moore) Pittman:

- i. Female, b. 1825-1830
- ii. Mariah, b. 1832

John and Martha Armfield

John Armfield was born about 1800 in North Carolina. He married Martha R. Franklin, the daughter of John and Elizabeth Franklin. John Armfield was a slave trader in partnership with Isaac Franklin, reputed to be the wealthiest man in Sumner County and the uncle of John's wife Martha.⁴³ John Armfield purchased "Spring Haven" in 1849 for \$6000, known then as "Hard Times." This purchase was reflected in the 1850 census of Sumner County, where John Armfield and his wife Martha and their family were listed with \$6000 worth of real estate.⁴⁴ At some point in time Armfield acquired two additional, small tracts of land and he sold 34 1/2 acres of the total to the husband of his wife's niece John J. Sanderson.

History tells us that John Armfield added a stone spring house and a mill. He also fenced the place with cedar rails, stone and poplar planks and built the finest

barn in Tennessee. Although some historians attribute the construction of "Spring Haven" to John Armfield, it seems more likely that he simply enhanced its value by adding amenities and additional rooms to an already existing structure.

Although John Armfield owned "Spring Haven" just over six years, he unquestionably left his mark on the home. On 30 October 1855 he sold the two original tracts which totalled 338 1/2 acres along with the two smaller tracts totalling 12 3/4 acres to Joseph Edwards.⁴⁵ The 34 1/2 acres he'd sold to Sanderson were excepted from the deed. The entire tract of land now contained 3173/4 acres and 28 poles and he sold it for \$15,896.25. The fact that Armfield more than doubled his investment in six years is indicative of the many improvements which he made.

John Armfield wrote his will on 20 April 1871, naming Dr. John W. Franklin as executor.⁴⁶ He named his sister Mary Hanner and divided his estate among five legatees - his wife Martha, Blanche Archer (wife of Stevenson Archer of Maryland), John Armfield Franklin, Adelle Franklin and J. S. N. Franklin, the last three children of Dr. John Franklin. His widow Martha died 10 May 1904 and is buried in Gallatin Cemetery. John and Martha never had any children, but served as parents for the children of Dr. John Franklin.

Joseph and Sarah Edwards

Joseph Edwards, was born March of 1815 in Norfolk County, Virginia, the son of Thomas and Mary (Baratee) Edwards.⁴⁷ He married twenty year old Sarah E. Keenan about 1850 when he was thirty-five, shortly before he purchased "Spring Haven" on 30 October 1855. Sarah was born in Courtland, Alabama in 1829, the daughter of Thomas and Calpurnia (Gray) Keenan.⁴⁸ His family lived at "Spring Haven" longer than any of its former residents. He was enumerated in the 1860 census of Sumner County with his wife and his first two children.⁴⁹ When the 1880 census was taken, all four of his children were living with him.⁵⁰

Joseph wrote his will on 19 April 1897. It was probated in Sumner County 8 July 1897 and directed that his land be divided equally among his four children.⁵¹ The tracts of land had changed in size and shape during the ownership of the Edwards family and had been resurveyed. In his estate division, the real estate was listed as a tract of 157.99 acres, a tract of 132.20 acres, and a tract of 113.40 acres for a total of 403.59 acres. Although the division did not specify which tract contained the home "Spring Haven," by drawing the surveys it was determined to be located on the 113.40 acre tract.

In 1901, under the division of the estate of Joseph Edwards, his daughter-in-law Robina Foster Edwards received the 113.40 acre tract of land in Civil District 5 containing "Spring Haven". The reason for this distribution was an agreement among the heirs, designed to

reimburse Mrs. Robina Edwards for \$5660 and her husband W. H. Edwards for \$2040, which Joseph Edwards deceased owed to them.⁵²

On 4 October 1904 when the land was sold, Robina and William combined their two tracts of land and both of them signed the deed, conveying "Spring Haven" and 245.6 acres to R. J. Lyles.⁵³ Children of Joseph and Sarah Edwards:

- i. Sarah E., b. 1850; m. Sumner Co., TN
27 January 1874 to John McCrary⁵⁴
- ii. William H., b. 1852; m. after 1880 Robina Foster
- iii. Mary E., b. 1861; m. Sumner Co., TN
4 September 1883 J. W. Foster⁵⁵
- iv. Joseph, b. 1864

The Early 1900's

After a long period of stability under the ownership of the Edwards family, "Spring Haven" in the early 1900's was subject to constantly changing ownership. No one stayed very long and no one left any apparent mark on the home.

R. J. Lyles and his wife Ann owned "Spring Haven" until 28 July 1908 when they conveyed it and the two combined tracts of 245.6 acres to J. W. Russworm,⁵⁶ who retained ownership until 9 November 1914 when he deeded it to F. J. and Lula W. Davis in the form of a 200 acre tract.⁵⁷ On 14 October 1916 they conveyed 200 acres and "Spring Haven" to J. E. Rodes⁵⁸ who deeded it to Francis M. Ewing less than a year later on 28 May 1917.⁵⁹ Six months later on 14 December 1917 Ewing conveyed it to Florence M. Carson "for her sole and separate use...as if she were an unmarried woman."⁶⁰ On 25 June 1920 Florence and her husband David B. Carson conveyed it to S. B. Fowler and Charles C. Fowler.⁶¹

On 8 January 1924 S. B. and his wife Bettie Reeves Fowler deeded the 200 acres where "Spring Haven" stood to James R. and Mary Love.⁶²

James R. and Mary Love

James Randall Love was born 19 April 1859, the son of James B. and Eliza (Plummer) Love. He married Mary Hooper.⁶³ James and Mary purchased the 200 acres where "Spring Haven" stood in 1924 and apparently lived there until their deaths. James R. Love was living in Nashville on 7 May 1929 when he wrote his will, but had moved back to Sumner County by the time he died on 7 September 1930. His will was probated on 29 September 1930 in Sumner County. He left the land and "Spring Haven" to his widow Mary during her lifetime and then to her children.⁶⁴ Mary

died intestate in Sumner County in July of 1935. Three of their children, Hooper, Mary and Annie conveyed their interest in the property to their sister Elizabeth Love Fowler Brittain in 1935.⁶⁵ Children of James R. and Mary (Hooper) Love:

- i. Hooper; d. by 1973; m. Rachel Howell.⁶⁶
- ii. Mary; m. Eldridge G. Doubleday.⁶⁷
- iii. Elizabeth, b. 1894.
- iv. Annie Grayson; m. E. Cliff Hancock;⁶⁸
m. 2nd to Robert K. Joslin by 1973.⁶⁹

Elizabeth Love was born in 1894,⁷⁰ the daughter of James Randle and Mary (Hooper) Love. She married first⁷¹ to Dr. Charles C. Fowler, who died in September of 1923. On 8 April 1931 she married William Claire Brittain in Sumner County.⁷² In 1935 when her mother died, Elizabeth purchased the interests of her siblings in the 10.4 acres of land where "Spring Haven" stood. Her second husband William died in September of 1960.⁷³ Elizabeth retained ownership of "Spring Haven" until 1967 when she sold it to the Pooles. Her son Dr. S. Benjamin Fowler and her other son's widow and children signed the deed.⁷⁴ Elizabeth died in January of 1973.⁷⁵ Children of Charles C. and Elizabeth (Love) Fowler:

- i. S. Benjamin.
- ii. Charles C., b. 2 April 1916; d. 2 November 1966 & bur. Gallatin City Cem; m. Mildred C.; Ch: Mary Love Fowler Carter, Charles C. Fowler, Jr. and William Hayes Fowler.

From the 1960's to the 1980's

During this time period, "Spring Haven" again had many different owners who did not remain long and who made little mark on the home. Some of those who enjoyed living at "Spring Haven" over the years remain unidentified, as they rented from the owners.

On 4 May 1967 B. M. Poole and his wife Shirley purchased "Spring Haven" and 10.4 acres of land from Elizabeth Love Fowler Brittain.

On 30 June 1971 Richard C. and Billie (Young) Hanson purchased "Spring Haven" and 3.1 acres of land from the Pooles.⁷⁶ During their ownership Hanson's House of Antiques was operated from the cabin on the property. On 14 August 1972 Richard and Billie were divorced and Billie received the home as part of the settlement.⁷⁷ On 3 April 1974 Larry J. and Cynthia Williams purchased "Spring Haven" from the divorcee under her maiden name of Billie Young.⁷⁸ On 15 January 1975 The Commerce Union Bank purchased the property

at a public sale from the Williams.⁷⁹ On 22 January 1975 Charles Edwards and Elizabeth P. Bosdell Jr. purchased "Spring Haven" from Commerce Union.⁸⁰ They retained ownership for over thirteen years, the longest stay of any owner since 1967. In 1988 they sold the home to Millard Bridges.

Millard and Teresa (Moss) Bridges

On 20 May 1988 Millard Bridges purchased "Spring Haven" and, as of this writing in May of 1991, is the owner.⁸¹ Millard is the son of Millard L. and Ivy (Holt) Bridges and his wife Teresa is the daughter of Fred and Anita (Davis) Moss.⁸²

Millard and Teresa have already left their mark on the house and made it their home. Millard has restored the home to its former elegance by completing a multitude of structural repairs and undertaking extensive landscaping. Teresa has attended to the interior decoration of the home. The cabin again houses an antique business, which Teresa operates. "Spring Haven" is once again loved and cherished.

A Pictorial History of Sumner County, Tennessee, 1786-1986 by Walter T. Durham and James W. Thomas. Hard cover, 8-1/2 x 11, 152 pp., bibliography, picture credits, complete index. Order from Sumner County Historical Society, 155 East Main Street, Gallatin, TN 37066, \$24.95 plus \$2.50 postage.

This is the third printing of this well received book, originally published in 1986 to celebrate the Sumner Bicentennial and Tennessee Homecoming '86. It includes 270 photographs from all sections of the county, depicting all periods of history beginning with the Indians who roamed the area thousands of years before the colonial settlers arrived.

A brief narrative opens each chapter and the photographs are intermingled with tracings of the county's evolution. Those who missed this valuable book on the first two printings will be pleased to know that it is again available.

Researching Marriage Records

by Byron Sistler

The searcher for Tennessee marriage records may have available to him up to three legal documents to confirm the when, where and who of such contracts. There were, beginning with a North Carolina law of 1778, licenses and bonds, and after 1837, marriage books. (Actually some counties maintained marriage books before 1838, but they were not required by state law until that year.)

The procedure was--

The prospective groom posted a bond guaranteeing that there was no legal

reason--such as impending bigamy--why the marriage could not take place. Originally this bond was 500 Pounds, but the marriage legislation passed by the Tennessee General Assembly in 1815 called for a bond of \$1250. Usually someone in addition to the groom would act as security for the bond. Such a person would be called a "bondsman."

The county official, having issued the bond, would then prepare a license, which the couple would take to a justice of the peace or minister for implementation. This official would then endorse the license and return it to the county clerk. Sometimes this last obligation was not fulfilled, with the result that no official testament that the marriage had been performed could be found.

A great many, if not most, of these licenses and bonds were lost or destroyed. This is why the advent of marriage books in 1838 was so important, and why, if a marriage took place that year or later, there is a much better chance of finding a record of it. At the same time, recording the marriage in a book increased the chance of error, so if one can find the original bond and/or license one is more likely to have found truth.

WHITWELLS IN THE CIVIL WAR

Hickman and Perry Counties, Tennessee

Andrew Jackson Whitwell Sr. (my great-grandfather) was a Sergeant in 2nd Co. K, 42nd Tennessee Infantry. He enlisted 9 Nov 1861, at Camp Cheatham in Robertson County. He, along with thousands of other Confederates was taken prisoner at the fall of Fort Donelson, 16 Feb 1862. He was sent to Camp Douglas, IL, in Chicago, where he was listed as sick on the muster roll. He, along with the rest of the Confederate prisoners, was sent to Vicksburg, MS on 4 Sep 1862 and exchanged. On 17 Nov 1862 he signed a requisition for supplies as Ordnance Sergeant at Port Hudson, LA. On 8 Mar 1863, being ill, he furnished a substitute for himself and was discharged. He died 24 Dec 1893, and is buried in the Whitwell-Bennett Cemetery in Ripley County, MO. He fathered twelve children.

Willis H. Whitwell, a brother of Andrew J., first enlisted 11 Jun 1861, at Nashville and was commissioned 3rd Lt of Co K 20th TN Infantry. In Sep 1861, he was a Brevet 2nd Lt, Co G 20th TN Infantry at Camp Buckner, KY. He fought, along with the rest of the 20th Inf, in the Battle of Fishing Creek, KY 19 Jan 1862, the Battle of Shiloh 6 & 7 Apr 1862, and others. At the reorganization 8 May 1862, at Corinth, MS he resigned and went home to Perry Co, TN to organize a company for the 10th TN Cavalry. Willis became Captain of Co C which was organized 8 Oct 1862, as part of Nathan Bedford Forrest's Cavalry. He and his company participated in many battles and skirmishes in Tennessee, Alabama, and Georgia including the Battle of Chickamauga, GA 19-21 Sep 1863, and a skirmish at Mossy Creek, TN 22 Dec 1863, where he was wounded by a cannon shot and his right leg was amputated. He resigned 14 Jun 1864, and was discharged 26 Jul 1864. Willis died 27 Aug 1887, and is buried in the Cruse Cemetery,

Advance, MO in Stoddard County. He fathered ten children.

William C. Whitwell, a brother of Andrew J. and Willis H., enlisted as a private in Co F, 53rd TN Infantry 1 Jan 1862, at Nashville. He participated in the Battle of Fort Donelson but escaped with, or behind, Bedford Forrest's Cavalry. He was also in the Battle of Atlanta 5 Sep 1864 where he was captured and sent to Louisville, KY 29 Oct 1864, and was transferred to Camp Douglas, IL 1 Nov 1864. William later took the Oath of Allegiance was discharged 8 May 1865. He died in December 1915, at Farmington, MO in Francois County. He fathered five children.

Andrew J., Willis H., and William C. were the sons of William and Rebecca (Curry) Whitwell, who also had three sons-in-law in the Confederacy. Andrew Jackson Dudley, husband of Nancy Whitwell, was also in Co F of the 53rd TN Infantry. He died 26 Feb 1896, and is buried in Beech Grove Cemetery in Hickman County. He fathered five children. Nacy M. Randel, husband of Rebecca Caroline Whitwell, was a sergeant in Co B 10th TN Cavalry. He enlisted 8 Oct 1862, at Linden in Perry County for three years and undoubtedly saw much action. He died 26 Mar 1914, and is buried in the Whitwell-Bennett Cemetery in Ripley County, Missouri. He fathered nine children.

John T. Murray, husband of Sarah A. Whitwell, was a 1st Lt in Co F, 63rd TN Infantry. He enlisted 1 Jan 1862, in Nashville as a private but was elected 1st Lt 26 Sep 1862. On 2 Oct 1863, at Marietta, GA General Pillow ordered him to go back to middle TN to procure socks, clothing, and blankets for their regiment, and also to bring out absentees and recruits. On 19 Dec 1863 he reported back to Dalton, GA and presented a bill "for mileage for myself from Rome, GA to Hickman Co, TN, 250 miles at

10 cents per mile, and for myself and one man from Hickman Co to Okoloma, MS 250 miles." Lt. Murray

A Rich Man's War and A Poor Man's Fight

As the Civil War progressed, volunteers waned and cash bounties were no longer effective. On 16 April 1862 the Confederacy passed its first conscription act to draft all white males between the ages of eighteen and thirty-five years for a term of three years. Six months later the age limit was raised from thirty-five to forty-five years. In February 1864, the draft age was again changed to include all males between the ages of seventeen and fifty years. In desperation, on 13 March 1865, the Confederacy passed a law offering freedom to slaves if they would enlist. The Union draft was not passed until 3 March 1863 and included men between the ages of twenty and forty-five. It was only used then if a given district had failed to produce its quota of troops.

The acts in both the North and the South allowed draftees to pay a commutation fee and avoid the draft. For the draftee in the South the fee was \$500 and in the North it was \$300.

Draftees could also avoid military service by supplying an able bodied substitute. Fees paid to the substitute to take the draftee's place varied according to supply and demand. A son could voluntarily replace a father or brother. Those who could afford the fee could hire a substitute and thus avoid the draft altogether.

Both the subscription and substitution were introduced as a means of freeing skilled labor [such as gunsmiths] for crucial war industries. But the privilege was used and abused until near the end of the war army morale was devastated. To the poor and drafted soldier, it became apparent that it was a rich man's war and a poor man's fight.

Information pertaining to substitution will be found primarily in pension applications.

was still carried on the roster of Co F on 9 Mar 1864. He was killed or died in the last year of the War, date and place unknown. He fathered three children.

Rev. Pleasant Whitwell (brother of William) and his wife Margaret Anderson Whitwell had four sons and one son-in-law who served in the Confederacy. Thomas Whitwell enlisted 9 Nov 1861 in Co K, 42nd TN Inf and was elected 1st Lt. He resigned in Jan 1862, and transferred to Co B 10th Cavalry where he was a 2nd Lt. He served until 28 Mar 1865, and took the oath of allegiance 2 May 1865, at Nashville. Thomas was a Judge in Perry County for many years. He died 25 Dec 1901, Maury Co, TN and is buried in the McClain Graveyard in Mt. Joy, Lewis County. He fathered ten children.

Elijah Houston Whitwell enlisted as a private in 2nd Co K, 42nd Infantry 8 Nov 1862, at Linden, TN for three years. On 30 Aug 1863 he was a patient at French's Division Hospital in Lauderdale, MS. On 20 Oct 1863, he was present with his company at Camp Cummings, AL near Mobile. Elijah H. Whitwell died at the Battle of Franklin, TN 30 Nov 1864, and is buried there in the TN section, grave #188, marked E. H. W. He fathered four children.

Pleasant W. Whitwell enlisted as a 1st Sgt. 8 Oct 1862, at Linden, TN in Co B 10th Cavalry for three years. By the end of the War he was in Co K of the 10th and 11th combined Cavalry. They surrendered at Citronelle, AL by Lt. General Richard Taylor (brother-in-law of Jefferson Davis) to General Edward R. S. Canby, U.S.A. Pleasant W. Whitwell was paroled at Gainesville, AL 10 May 1865. He died 9 Jan 1893, in Perry Co, TN, burial place unknown. He fathered eleven children.

John A. Whitwell enlisted 29 Nov 1862, in Co C 10th Cavalry, Willis Whitwell's Company. He was paid \$24.40 on 30 Apr 1863, for the use of his horse and was present in May and June 1863. John returned to Perry County after the War. He died 8 Mar

1911 in Gibson Co, TN and is buried in Yorkville. He fathered twelve children.

Carroll H. Ward, the husband of Martha Ann Whitwell, was also in Capt Willis Whitwell's Co C, 10th Cavalry. He was absent sick on the muster roll during May and June 1863. He died or was killed some time after that, date and burial place unknown. Carroll fathered seven children.

John Anderson Whitwell, brother of Pleasant and William, had two sons who served in the Confederacy, and two sons-in-law. Solomon Jackson Whitwell enlisted as a private 9 Jul 1861 at Camp Lee, TN in the 2nd Batt'l. of TN Mounted Volunteers. It was consolidated in May 1862, and became Wheeler's 6th Cavalry. "Jack" Whitwell became a 3rd Sgt in Co I. He was home ill in Hickman Co from Oct to Dec 1863. Later, back with the Cavalry, "he was cut off from command in crossing the Tennessee River by the enemy at the time Genl. Forrest crossed the river leaving Tennessee on the expedition in Sep 1864." The Family Bible says he died 3 Feb 1865. Spence's "History of Hickman County" says he was killed at Columbia, SC. His burial place is unknown. He fathered four children.

Thomas Benton Whitwell was also in Co I, 1st Cavalry, according to Spence, and was killed at Triune, TN. The Family Bible gives his death date as 4 Jun 1863, age 19. His burial place is unknown; he died unmarried.

Lucius Samuel Dean, husband of Harriet Amanda Whitwell, was also a Sgt in Co I, 6th Cavalry. He lost an eye. Lucius died 30 Nov 1895, and is buried in the Bakerville Cemetery in Humphreys Co, TN. He fathered seven children. Wiley Perry Gentry, the husband of Ladocia Ann Whitwell, was a private in D Co, 9th Cavalry. He died 6 Jun 1912, and is buried in the Beech Grove Cemetery in Hickman County. He fathered four children.

Thomas B. Whitwell (brother of William, Pleasant, and John A.) had one son and two sons-in-law in the Confederacy. Samuel M. Whit-

well enlisted 9 Nov 1861, at Camp Cheatham as a private in 2nd Co K, 42nd TN Infantry. He was taken prisoner at Fort Donelson 16 Feb 1862, and sent to Camp Douglas, IL. He was exchanged at Vicksburg, MS 17 Nov 1862. He was present at Camp Cummings, AL 20 Oct 1863. He died 25 Sep 1864, unmarried, buried Confederate Cemetery, Griffin, GA.

John Moses Randel, husband of Susan Jayne Whitwell, was a 2nd Lt in Co B of the 10th Cavalry. He died 2 Jun 1909 in Hardeman Co, TX and is buried in the Chillicothe Cemetery. He fathered five children. Walker Sobieski Davis, the husband of Mary E. Whitwell, was a private in the 9th Cavalry. He was living at Valley View, TX in 1882. His death date and place of burial are unknown. He fathered four children.

The other brother of William, Pleasant, John A., and Thomas B., Robert Whitwell moved to Missouri and Kansas before 1860. He had one son, James Grimes Whitwell, who served in Co E 17th Kansas Infantry USA from 30 Jul 1864 to 16 Nov 1864. He died 25 Feb 1920 in Brice, MO, Laclede Co, and is buried in the Flatwoods Cemetery. He fathered ten children.

Llewellyn (Allen) F. Whitwell enlisted 9 Jul 1861 as a private in Co I, 6th Cavalry, the same day as his cousin Solomon Whitwell. He was captured 6 Aug 1863, at Loudon or Linden, TN; the record says both. He was imprisoned at Camp Douglas, IL from 6 Aug 1863 to 14 Mar 1865, when he was transferred to prison at Pt. Lookout, MD and forwarded to City Point, VA for exchange. He was listed in Tate House Hospital as a steward or patient in Greensboro, NC 28 Apr 1865, and was paroled soon after when Confederate Genl. Joseph E. Johnston surrendered to Genl. William Tecumseh Sherman 26 Apr 1865. He died 16 Oct 1904, in Rains Co, TX. He fathered four children.

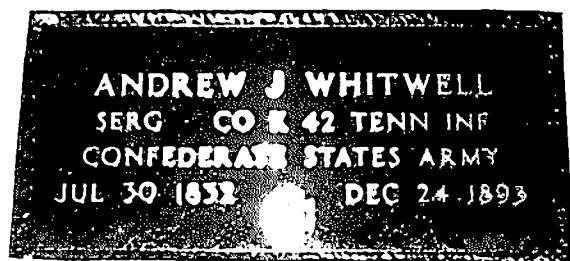
His brother John Holman Whitwell served on the Union side in Co K 7th Kansas Cavalry from Nov 1861 to 29 Nov 1864. He died 23 Nov

1904, also in Rains Co, TX and is buried in the Prospect Cemetery three miles west of Emory, TX. He fathered seven children.

John H. and Allen Whitwell were the sons of Holman Whitwell, believed to be a first cousin to William, Pleasant, John A., Thos. B. and Robert Whitwell. John H. and Allen were living in Henderson Co., TN in the 1860 census; in 1870, after the War, they were living together in McNairy Co, TN.

GENEALOGICAL PROBLEM SOLVING

by Jo White Linn, C.G., C.G.L., R.G.

A professional genealogist approaches a great many more complex genealogical problems than the average researcher simply because most people do not employ a professional until they have exhausted their capabilities without success. The usual client letter details how many years have been spent on the problem, and the usual client is dismayed at being told NOT TO SEND BUSHELS of accumulated material that may have bearing on the problem.

If the client is asked to send two pages only of preliminary background information, he is forced to reduce his problem to a fairly simple statement. Once the genealogist has defined the problem and considered it in light of her research, she may well request the client's materials that speak to a particular point.

More to the point is this: most researchers could solve their own problems if they could state them.

What the genealogist must determine is the response to the question, "What Do We Know and What Do We Need To Know?"

What We Know

"What We Know" can be initially confined to the immediate facts concerning the point where we are stuck. We are stuck at our earliest proved ancestor. And what are the essential facts we need ideally to know about the earliest proved ancestor?

1. Name, date, and place of birth, death, and marriage of the ancestor and spouse, names and dates and places of birth of all known children, where known.
2. Date the proved ancestor can first be identified in the area.
3. Date that he migrated, if he did.
4. Proof for all the above.

What We Need To Know

1. Answers to any of the facts not supplied.

How to Analyze the Facts in Hand and Discover What We Need To Know

When we chart the material, either informally or on a family group sheet, we can immediately spot inconsistencies and problem areas. We can see if there are chronological problems by noting the ages of parents and children. How old was the mother when the children were born? Is there indication of an earlier or later marriage suggested by the ages of the children? Do we have evidence of migration? At what time? Are we in a time period when there was military conflict in which the ancestor might have participated? Is there an indication of ethnic origin? Would that suggest a religious affiliation?

The next question we ask in our approach to the genealogical problem is this: In what record or record groupings are we apt to find the information that will answer our questions? If those records are not extant, with what other record might we find our information?

Which Records We Examine and in What Order

We examine first the records that are most easily accessible. While we may turn first to published abstracts of primary source materials, it is incumbent upon us, once we have found a promising abstract, to secure the complete record, either the recorded record or the original record. By that I mean that the complete will recorded in the original will book is good evidence; a copy of the original will is best evidence.

In working with any genealogical problem, certain primary records are indispensable: deeds, wills, tax lists, and court minutes. These records are usually available in the county or in the state archives, and they provide specific information about specific individuals in a specific time period.

In the event that those records are not extant, what are other records that might fill the gap, in order of importance? Let us look briefly at what information may be supplied in some of these records.

DEEDS. Deeds are enormously important. If, when an ancestor migrated to a new place, he disposed of his land in the old place, that deed of disposition may

well tell precisely when and where he acquired the real property. Since the only two ways to acquire real property are through either purchase or inheritance, the researcher stands to gain enormously by discovering the original acquisition of the property. If the deeds are not extant, tax lists may well show the acreage and an approximate location. Additionally, there may be land entries that will provide a rough description of the original parcel. The minutes of the county court may well show deeds being either proved, affirmed, or acknowledged, and those minutes may also provide the amount of acreage as well as the grantor, grantee, the name of a wife relinquishing her dower interest in the property, and the name of the witness who proved the instrument.

If the deeds are not available for a certain time-period, the examination of deeds recorded later may well describe the property in interior references and recitals. Many deeds were not recorded until years after the transaction took place, many times not until the property changed hands again. Many deeds in original colonies detail the entire chain of title from the original grant, and a deed of sale from a subsequent owner may have that chain of title. Additionally, many land transactions may be indicated in records dealing with divisions of estates, including plats picturing the division of the land. If the deeds of one county are not available, perhaps the deeds of the parent county, a derivative county, or a neighboring county may be extant and may provide information.

WILLS. If the wills are not extant, some estate records may nevertheless survive. Court minutes will provide the date at which a will was proved and the witness who proved it, providing an approximate date of death since a will was normally probated at the term of court following the death. Guardian bonds may supply the names of minor children, and apprentice bonds may also have that information. Partition proceedings will show the division of the land, and

deeds may show the execution of the partition proceedings. Equity Court minutes may show disposition of an undivided tract. Supreme Court records may show settlement of complicated estates that have been disputed.

COURT MINUTES. If the court minutes are not extant, the dockets may survive and will provide principals and charges for cases to be tried. There may be separate books with venire lists and road orders. There may be guardian and apprentice bonds. The list goes on, but one of the most difficult losses to overcome is that of court minutes. These are the records of an area that contain the largest number of names, resulting from the administration of local government.

TAX LISTS. While tax lists supply the names of far more adults than the census, the census will at least supply the names of heads of household. While the pre-1850 census supplies the names only of the heads of household, the tax lists provide the names of all taxable males and the names of administrators or executors of taxable estates not yet settled.

CENSUS. The population schedule, while usually the best locator tool of any, is often the most over-utilized and over-weighted record employed by beginning researchers in their analysis of a genealogical problem. It is important to realize that the enumerations in each household, even if accurate, detail the members of the household, not the members of the family. The most under-utilized census is the 1880 census, in which each person supplied his place of birth and the place of birth of his mother and father. The mortality, slave, agriculture (1850, 1860, 1870, and 1880), manufacturing (extant beginning with 1810, 1820, and 1840), and industry census (1850-1880) are under-utilized and provide fascinating detail that bring ancestors to life.

ADDITIONALLY. There are many, many other records available in various jurisdictions what will lend valuable information. Church records may well provide vital statistics, as may Bible records and tombstone records.

When we, the researchers, have found the records that bear on the problem, we are equipped only with the gear, the tools, as it were, that will enable us to attack the genealogical problem. The defining quality of our search will be the analysis and evaluation of the evidence according to the laws of the period and the rules of evidence. And that is another article in itself.

ROCK ISLAND ARSENAL

Rock Island Arsenal is located in an area known as Quad Cities that is composed of Davenport and Bettendorf, Iowa; Rock Island and Moline, Illinois. The island itself comprises approximately 946 acres, is nearly three miles long and three-fourths of a mile wide, and is surrounded by the Mississippi River. Rock Island Arsenal is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

In 1804, Sauk and Fox Indians ceded Rock Island and other lands to the United States in a treaty negotiated at St. Louis, Missouri. After the war (1812), the Army built a chain of forts along the upper Mississippi River to keep the British trades out and the Indians quiet. Fort Armstrong was built in 1816-1817 on the western tip of Arsenal Island. In 1832, Fort Armstrong served as headquarters for troops engaged in the Black Hawk War. This was the last Indian uprising in Illinois and the fort was abandoned in 1836.

In 1862, an act of Congress established an arsenal at Rock Island. Construction of a small arsenal for repair and storage purposes began in 1863. In that year, the U. S. Army Ordnance Corps began construction of a storehouse on the island near the ruins of Fort Armstrong. This storehouse was completed in 1867 and is known today as the Clock Tower building.

During the Civil War, the U. S. Army Quartermaster Corps erected and operated a prisoner of war camp on the north central section of the island. The prison barracks were razed after the war and arsenal officers' quarters were constructed on the site of the prison. The Rock Island Prison Barracks consisted of 84 wooden barracks enclosed by a 12-foot high fence.

The first prisoners were southern troops captured in the Battle of Lookout Mountain and Missionary Ridge by General Grant's Army, November 26-27. Five

thousand five hundred and ninety-two prisoners were received on December 3, 1863. The prison doctors found 94 cases of smallpox in its most virulent form. Active as a prison for 20 months, there were 12,215 prisoners confined during this period; the most confined at any one period was a little over 8,000. There were 41 successful escapes. Some died while confined, principally from small pox. The last prisoner was discharged from the prison hospital in July 1865.

Register of Confederate Dead -- Rock Island, Illinois Confederate Cemetery

Originally containing the bodies of 1,961 prisoners who died while confined here during the Civil War, 11 bodies have since been removed to their home state, one as recently as 1955. Each Memorial Day, Confederate flags are placed before every headstone, a firing detail fires three volleys, and a bugler sounds taps.

RESEARCH IN RUTHERFORD COUNTY, TENNESSEE

Researching for genealogical, historical, and legal information in Rutherford County can be fairly easy and enjoyable. The facilities storing such information are within close proximity, usually quite accessible, and staffed with willing qualified personnel. If, as a researcher, you anticipate a trip to Murfreesboro to work, here are a few keys to the city.

Linebaugh Public Library

Probably the best place to start is the Linebaugh Public Library. It is located just one block north of the Public Square. In the library you will find the "Tennessee Room," a storehouse of genealogical information. It is necessary to register at the main desk to gain admittance into the Tennessee Room; however, once situated, the researcher can browse through local census records, small local histories, cemetery records, nearly all the Rutherford County Historical Society's publications, and numerous state and local histories.

Linebaugh Library's open stacks contain a large collection of Tennessee history concerning not only counties and communities but a great wealth of material about the Civil War in Tennessee and Rutherford County. The library has a microfilm collection consisting primarily of the *Daily News Journal* from March 1931 to April 1971. Microfilm readers are available upon request but there is not a reader-copier available. While at the Linebaugh Library be sure to register in their surname file and check to see if any name you are researching is of interest to others. The library staff is small but very willing to give direction and information. The Linebaugh Library will be moving to new and larger facilities in March of 1992.

County Clerk

The Rutherford County Clerk's Office has an abundance of information for the genealogical researcher. This office is on the northeast corner of the Public Square. Herein you will find a front window room with both sitting and standing work tables. Smoking is permitted in this area. The records consist of Marriages from 1804 to the present, Wills from 1804 to the present, Estate Settlement Books, Minute Books, several brief Birth and Death Books, Guardian Books, and Power of Attorney Records, to name the most prevalent.

The Clerk's Office personnel are very courteous and helpful to the researchers but be sure you have tried real hard first before you enlist their aid because it is a busy place. A wonderful tool at your disposal is their copying machine. Copies are reasonable (25 cents) and you can make them yourself or get help. Please remember to pay for any copies you make so that we may continue to have the privilege of the copier. While at the Clerk's office be sure to ask about the OLD WILLS. Several years ago a large collection of very old Rutherford County wills were found and are now in the Clerk's office copied, indexed, and bound for your use. One last point about the Rutherford County Clerk's Office is the Register book. Usually lying in the front window is a red notebook for you to register the surnames you are researching. Check to see if anyone needs your help or if someone can help you. It's fun.

Register of Deeds

Next stop, while right downtown, is the Register of Deeds Office. It is on the fifth floor

of the Judicial Building--that's the five story building next to the County Clerk's Office. The elevator is slow but the steps are good for the heart, climb three and ride two. The Register's Office is on both sides of the hall. The right side holds the older dockets. To know for sure where you need to be go to the left and ask at the desk. In these areas you will find such delights as military discharge records, deeds, trust deeds, chattel mortgages, probate deeds, and a church property list.

You may be interested to know that Rutherford County slave sales were recorded in with the land deeds and not with chattel. Of the older deed dockets you will find about 3 missing, some say the Yankees burned them. An employee of the Register's Office undertook the task of retyping many of the old indexes to the dockets and has made wonderful progress. Her volunteer work makes ours much easier--be sure to tell her so. While in the Register's Office, should you come to a dead end explain to the staff your problem and watch them go after answers. If they have a few moments they will help you or make sure you know where to go look. Asking questions in this office has paid off more than once for this researcher.

On the wall here is a large, framed, 1878 Beers map of Rutherford County. Many of the names of property owners of 1878 are listed on the map. You may purchase one of these maps at the County Clerk's Office.

Rutherford County Archives

The Rutherford County Archives is a very small facility on the second floor of the Courthouse. The hours are limited and it is best to know what you want before you go there as staffing is severely limited. However, making the effort is worth it. You will find at the Archives a few Birth and Death records and some naturalization records. These along with physician's and dentist's registers may seem unusual for an archives. The reason they are there is that many of the dockets presently in the Archives were once stored in a shed located behind the County Health Department. Also in the shed were

Health Department Records. When the shed was torn down for a new Health Department all the books were taken to the Archives.

Other items of interest at the Archives are the early county Record Books. These have been copied and bound and are available in the County Clerk's office also. The Archives holds the old Fox scalp books, voter registrations, poll tax books, voter registrations, poll tax books, merchants license applications, merchants bonds, and beverage bond books. Of greatest value are the Tax Books which date from 1877 to 1973. These are readily available and easy to understand. Another real treasure at the Archives is the loose records from Chancery Court dating 1866 to 1926. The greater share of these loose records are still in the files as placed by their originators. Of over 300 drawers, only about 13 have been processed for modern convenience. But do not let that hold you back, for if you have a name you are researching there is an index to these records. It may take a day or so to access them and get copies.

Should you wish to use the Rutherford County Archives it is open on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons from 1:00 to 4:00. Or you may call Dr. James Neal in the History Department at MTSU (898-2300) or myself (451-4877).

County Clerk of Courts Office

The Rutherford County Clerk of Courts Office is useful in researching more recent legal transactions. The staff is helpful but quite busy. It may be wiser to use a researcher that goes there on a regular basis.

Todd Library, Middle Tennessee State University

One of the finest places in Rutherford County to do genealogical and historical research is at Middle Tennessee State University's Todd Library. It is wonderful. First go to the Administration Building and acquire a visitors parking permit. Then try to park as close to the Library as you can, remember a little walk is good for your cardiovascular system. Once in the Library all is well. The entire card catalog is computer-

ized; if you are not a computer user do not let that deter you. Just walk up to a unit and type the letters "BE" for BEGIN and then push the key marked ENTRY--the computer will tell you how to do the rest. If you have any problems go to the Reference Desk and ask for help.

Under the subject "Genealogy" there are 569 entries. These range from census to state and local histories, and from Bible inscriptions to Genealogy How To books. The college library uses the Dewey Decimal numbering system and most of the genealogy works are close together.

There is a Tennessee Room with a vast collection of state, local, and folklore histories. This room is really hidden so ask where it is and when you find it you will feel like you have discovered a great treasure.

MTSU's library has a magnificent microfilm collection. Newspapers from not only Tennessee, but the nation, and as early as the Pre-Revolutionary era. The microfilm section has several reader-copiers and copies are only ten cents each. While at the MTSU library use the Reference Desk. The staff members in that area are excellent, full of humble knowledge, diligent, and pleasant. More than once they have been of a great service to me and I thank them for that help.

Residents of Rutherford County may obtain a borrower's card and check out up to two books. Non-residents will have to use books on site. However, there are about ten copiers available throughout the library and copies can cost as little as four cents each. Go to the second floor and ask the Periodicals Desk for help in purchasing and using a COPY CARD. By using the card your copies will cost a penny less and you will not have to worry about change. I usually put about \$5.00 on the card -- no more in case I lose the card. This card slides into the copier and pays for the copies.

I enjoy the times I research at MTSU's library because there is so much there and I never go away empty-handed. The KEY is to ask for help at the Reference Desk until you are sure of what you are doing. You will not be imposing; they are great help. Also there are about 15,000

students nearby, any one of which can, and usually will, help you with the computer, high shelves, the copy machines, and directions. These students have a reputation for being friendly.

One particular publication that may interest researchers is Publication #32, which includes A RESEARCHER'S GUIDE TO RUTHERFORD COUNTY by David Rowe. If, as a researcher, you are anticipating doing an extensive amount of research in Rutherford County you may want to consider spending \$7.00 to obtain this book. Dr. Rowe put together an informative and readable directory of government documents, what they are, how to find and interpret them, and dates of available records.

The Historical Society's membership is \$12.00 per year which includes the current year's publication.

LDS (Mormons)

Stones River National Battlefield

Stones River National Battlefield and Cemetery is located on the north edge of Murfreesboro. Should you be researching the Civil War data be sure to stop in and visit with the Park Historian and Rangers. They have an extensive private library and if time permits they may be able to answer some of your problems. Available to the public is a Register of soldiers buried at that cemetery giving their units, place of death, and location of grave.

The Park also offers for sale a wide variety of books dealing with the Civil War from local histories to the National scene. While you are there be sure to see the museum, tour the battlefield, and weep in the cemetery. The time you spend at Stone's River Battlefield will be time well spent.

The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints maintains a genealogical research facility in Murfreesboro. The Mormon records are well worth looking into if you have the time. Usually they are not abounding in local information but act as an outstation for Salt Lake City. The LDS Church in Murfreesboro is about three blocks west of the University on Clark Street; call first.

Plan your trip to Rutherford County first and you will enjoy it so much more. It will be an interesting, and hopefully fruitful, adventure for you.

A LOUISIANA LAWYER RENDERS A TITLE OPINION

The Defense Plant Corporation making a routine investigation of the titles to a proposed plant site in Louisiana, received title proof as far back as 1803. A legal adviser was not satisfied with this and wrote for evidence as to prior title. He received the following reply from a Louisiana attorney.

Gentlemen:

I note your comment upon the fact that the record of title sent you as applying to the lands under consideration dates only from the year 1803 and your request for the extension of the records prior to that date.

Please be advised that the government of the United States acquired the territory, including the tract to which your inquiry applies, by purchase from the government of France who acquired title by conquest from the government of Spain; the government of Spain acquired title by discovery by one Christopher Columbus, a resident of Genoa, Italy, traveler and explorer, who by agreement concerning the acquisition of title to any lands discovered traveled and explored under the sponsorship and patronage of her Majesty, the Queen of Spain. And the Queen of Spain had verified her agreement and received sanction of her title by consent of the Pope, a resident of Rome, Italy, and ex-officio representative and vice-regent of Jesus Christ. Jesus Christ was the son and heir apparent of the Almighty God from whom He received His authority and the Almighty God made Louisiana.

I trust this complies with your request.

White by their guardian ad litem James H. Lester and Bob, John and others, slaves of Alfred C. White, deceased by their guardian ad litem Amos R. Richardson, Plaintiffs, and Rufus G. P. White, Newton White, John R. White, Elizabeth Johnson, wife of M. M. Johnson, Malvina Boyd, wife of John Boyd, and Benty Thomas, wife of Caleb Thomas, Defendants, present.... Be it remembered that heretofore, to wit on the 9th day of April 1860, the clerk of Giles County Court filed in the clerk's office of said circuit court a transcript of record from said county court in the words and figures following to wit: "State of Tennessee, Giles County, I, Amos R. Richardson, clerk of the county court of Giles County, hereby certify that at the April Term of said court 1860 a proceeding was had in said court in the words and figures following to wit: R. G. P. White and others vs Emily White and others. Contested will of A. C. White, dec'd.:

I, Amos R. Richardson clerk of the county court of Giles County hereby certify that at the April Term 1860 the following petition was filed in said court ... "To the worshipful county court of Giles county ... your petitioners R. S. P. White, Newton White, John R. White, M. M. Johnston and his wife Elizabeth Johnston, John Boyd and his wife Malvina Boyd and Caleb Thomas would respectfully represent and show unto your Honor that Archibald C. white departed this life in the County of Bolivar, in the State of Mississippi, in the latter part of October 1859 leaving him surviving his four brothers to wit your petitioner Rufus G. P. White and Newton White and Alfred C. W. White and John M. White and his nephew and three nieces, children of his deceased brother Benton White, to wit the said John R. White, Elizabeth Johnson wife of M. M. Johnson, Malvina wife of John Boyd and Benty wife of Caleb Thomas his only heirs at law and distributees him surviving all of whom are now living. The said Archibald C. White was never married and left no children him surviving and his parents died many years before him. He died siezed and possessed of a town lot in the town of Pulaski, about 1600 or 1700 acres of land in Bolivar County, Mississippi

and about __ [blank] slaves in Giles County, Tennessee, besides notes, cases in action, etc....

H. A. Rutledge and others vs F. B. Fogg, Executor
(Original Bill filed in Davidson County Chancery Court

...that the City Government elected by the people was displaced on April 5, 1862 and that on April 10, 1862 the officers appointed by Andrew Johnson, Military Governor, took possession of the city, these officers appointed by military authority held the possession of the city until October 5, 1865, and it was during this period that the taxes were levied. Mrs. S. S. M. Rutledge, I am informed, was born in 1783 and died in 1865 at the residence of Mr. F. B. Fogg in this city, where she spent the last six or seven years of her life...

Deposition of William Driver: In answer to interrogations witness deposes as follows: In March 1863 a commission was convened at Nashville by order of Gen. Rosecrans to inquire into the damage done to property by the U. S. forces in this vicinity. Mrs. Rutledge presented a claim for \$4,000.00 for damage done to the College Hill property... The property was occupied by the Federal troops from the time they came here. The fences were all destroyed, the houses were occupied as horse stables. They had cut down 166 trees that would have made 140 cords of wood, a fine well was partly filled up... We suggested the allowance to Mrs. Rutledge of from \$400 to \$450 for one year's rent and this, I am told, was paid.

Statement of Russell Houston: "In the fall of 1862 I went with Francis B. Fogg to the property owned by the late Mrs. S. S. M. Rutledge, adjoining the university property, to examine its condition and to endeavor to prevent its destruction or other injuries to it by the military authorities of the United States, a portion of the army being then in possession of it occupying as a camp, with tents, mules, wagons and such other articles as are usually connected with an army. We found the place very much damaged, the dwelling house particularly, one room of which the floors having been taken out, was used as a stable for horses, the whole presenting a very delapidated appearance...."

The question in this case arises under the will of Henry Hatcher, dec'd. in which occur the following passages, among others:

"...Thirdly, I decree my tract of land to be sold by my executor and give him power to transfer the same lying in District #1, Montgomery County, containing about 200 acres. Terms - one third to be paid in cost to my executor and the remainder to be divided into two annual installments with bond and good security - a lien on the property until the money is paid ...

"Fourthly, I give to Sallie Orgain my sister \$3,000.00 the money from the sale of my tract of land to be paid over to her by my executor to be invested in such property as she needs - at her death the property to be divided equally among her children.

said Quarles. It appears from the foregoing reports that on the 5th day of December 1859 the time the same was made there remained this sum unaccounted for to wit: \$2542.11. Since that time the following payments have been made to wit: To William R. Vaughan his distributive share \$889.33; to Wm. R. Vaughan attorney for Jno. R. Hitt his share \$177.86; to Ammon T. Quarles attorney for Mildred H. Patton and Geo. Vaughan \$254.08, totalling \$1321.27, and leaving this sum unpaid \$1220.84, which is to be distributed to the following named persons to wit:
