

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Editor's Thoughts

It's wonderful to have enough material on hand to juggle which is the only way an issue gets together. We can never use everything we want, or plan to, in a particular quarterly. In this issue you will find an article on Certification of Genealogists. We've wanted to run something on this subject for some time but couldn't find anyone who wanted to write it. Then comes a press release from Gale Bamman that covered the topic from the point of view of those wishing to be certified. She added material to answer some basic questions of ours. I felt readers would be interested in just what all those initials after names mean. We need to point out a few things on this subject.

Gale answers our first question very nicely—just what exactly do all those initials after names mean?

Next, if I'm hiring someone to help with research do I need to use a certified genealogist and how would I find one? Do I need to use someone certified or accredited?

There are a lot of excellent professional genealogists out there who are not certified or accredited. Either they're older and figure it's a little late to bother or they hate the idea of extra paperwork or detest formality or all of the above. I'm married to an all of the above. There are also a lot of so-so and incompetent people trying their best. Many societies and libraries maintain a list of local researchers. If complaints (documented as justified) are received, a researcher would usually be dropped from the list. Your best bet is to work from a referral, with or without initials after the name. Our next choice would be to hire someone with those initials. The requirements for certification are stringent enough that anyone not competent should be weeded out.

How do I find an accredited* professional?

The Board for Certification of Genealogists will provide a list, arranged by state, for \$3.50. Write to: BCG, PO Box 5816, Falmouth, VA 22403-5816. Queries or comments regarding the certification status of any individual using the BCG initials or seal are welcomed. The above list is mailed free to libraries that supply a legal-size envelope with postage to cover two-ounce, first-class mail.

And, last, if you're interested in the possibility of certification for yourself, Gale's article will give you enough information to decide if you want to pursue it.

In this connection I am pleased to observe I should be off the board by 1996, and certainly will no longer hold my present position.



Who is this Man?

One more item from our January Show-and-Tell meeting. Barbara Cantrell brought this picture and would like to know who he is.

This picture was purchased at a church bazaar in the 1980's (Andrew Price Methodist Church). The photograph was found behind the flower painting, actual size 5" x 7". It has previously resided in a frame with an oval opening (see the faded outline).







There is a stamp on the cardboard backing of the frame. This is the "Blue Eagle" of the National Industrial Recovery Act, an attempt in 1933 to prop up the economy. Among other things, codes fixed maximum hours and minimum wages. Its motto was "We do our part." This act was later declared unconstitutional.

In March of this year copies of this article were mailed to editors of genealogical periodicals and journals across the United States. I asked Gale to add, for our readers, explanations about the various categories of certification and brief comments on other credentials or honorific initials accorded to qualifying genealogists.

CERTIFICATION OF GENEALOGISTS:*

An Open Letter** by Gale Williams Bamman, Certified Genealogist Post Office Box 70161, Nashville, TN 37207

Most genealogists would agree that verification of facts is important; however, standards of proof have changed radically. In the simpler days of the '30s and '40s a professional genealogist authenticated his or her client report by including a signed statement worded something like this: "I certify the within to be accurate." Who nowadays would be willing to accept the contents of a report bearing only that kind of "verification?" Probably not even a beginning researcher! With technological advances and the increasingly educated awareness of the genealogical community, today's sophisticated clients want and expect to see *documented proof* backing up a report's findings. Furthermore, those clients are more selective when they hire researchers to locate that proof. They look for experienced and capable professionals, of course; but also, more and more, they want professionals who are certified as well.

CERTIFICATION

Certification status is granted by the Board for Certification of Genealogists, a non-profit organization created in 1964 and dedicated to promoting the highest standards of competence and ethics in the genealogical field. The various categories for which certification is offered are:

C.G.—Certified Genealogist. One who is proficient in all types of genealogical research and analysis, capably resolves pedigree problems, and is experienced in the compilation of well-crafted family histories.

C.G.R.S.—Certified Genealogical Record Specialist. One who searches both original and published records, understands all genealogical resources relating to his or her specialty, and provides detailed information concerning the contents of the records examined. A C.G.R.S. is not certified to construct a pedigree or prepare a family history.

C.A.L.S.—Certified American Lineage Specialist. One who reconstructs single-line descents and prepares hereditary-society applications—drawing upon a sound knowledge of resources and a skilled appraisal of the acceptability of both original documents and printed material. *American* in this sense is not limited to the United States.

C.A.I.L.S.—Certified American Indian Lineage Specialist. One who conducts research to determine descent from a historical Indian tribe indigenous to North America, being well versed in the pertinent material and applicable standards within this specialty.

C.G.L.—Certified Genealogical Lecturer. One who gives public addresses, of an educational nature, on specific genea-

logical topics or on related subjects pertinent to the tracing of family relationships. The C.G.L. must also pass the requirements for C.G.R.S.

C.G.I.—Certified Genealogical Instructor. One who plans and conducts a full course of genealogical instruction, covering all aspects of methodology and resources. The C.G.I. must also pass requirements for C.G.

Intern—One who, although not meeting all requirements for certification, has shown genuine genealogical talent and evidence of hard work developing genealogical skills. Interns are encouraged to undertake client research which is reported annually to the appointed advisor for evaluation.

REWARDS OF CERTIFICATION

Approval and acceptance of your application for certification announces to your peers that you have met certain requirements and standards and that you are recognized as a capable and knowledgeable researcher. Your certification commands recognition also from those with whom you have contact in your workaday world--librarians, clerks, historians, and other genealogists.

If you are a professional researcher, benefits accrue for your client, as well. The BCG offers an arbitration service to handle misunderstandings that may arise between client and researcher. This feature protects both parties and is non-partisan. Clients who understand what certification in this field entails know that as a certified researcher you will be working at a high level of expertise, that you will render quality research, and that you will abide by a code of ethics. The results are exemplified in a statement made by one of my

recent clients: "I'm so pleased with your work I'm going to use only certified persons from now on."

Genealogical research is as valid a field of study as historical research; and, in my opinion, it's now more viable in the public eye. This is due in large measure to the upgrading of research standards encouraged by the BCG. As more and more professionals attain certification, the field gains respect from professionals in other arenas. As an example, geneticists and physicians are increasingly calling on genealogists to supply background health data on their patients' ancestors or on subjects in their clinical research projects.

HOW TO BE CERTIFIED:

As a volunteer at the Board for Certification of Genealogists booth during recent national genealogical conferences, I've repeatedly been asked three questions: "Do you need a certain number of years of research experience, professional or otherwise, before you can apply for certification? Must you have published books and articles in the field? Are you required to attend genealogical conferences, seminars, institutes, and workshops?" The answer to all of these is no. However, these arenas do provide learning opportunities that can help you increase your knowledge and upgrade your skills and abilities. The expertise you gain as a result of your participation will be reflected in your application.

What are the criteria used by the BCG to gauge an applicant's competence? They are the quality of your work and the evidence you submit to demonstrate your knowledge about the records and repositories within your area of specialization. These are the benchmarks by which your application is judged. The submission requirements and standards expected of those who seek the rank of a Certified Genealogical Record Specialist are as follow:

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS:2

General Requirements:

As an applicant for certification, you will be required to provide examples of your work to illustrate your knowledge of bibliography, resources, and research methodology. These examples should reveal your proficiency in identifying documentary evidence and your ability to evaluate research results in the context of a specific problem. You will also be expected to demonstrate knowledge in your area of research and general skills of communication and professionalism.

As in most testing processes in the business world, you will be asked to:

describe your general educational background;

- list genealogical instructional courses completed, conferences and/or workshops attended, dates of attendance, and any certificates received or degrees earned;
- •enumerate your genealogy-related activities (such as society memberships, offices held, and volunteer activities);
- outline briefly your research experience and any specialized training you think has benefited you in this field.

You will also be asked to:

- explain why you seek certification and whether you intend to accept genealogical commissions;
- discuss your accessibility to the records of your geographical specialty;
- transcribe, abstract, and comment upon the genealogical value of two documents provided by the Board; and comment as to their genealogical value and your research plans based on the clues they contain;
- choose two books, articles, finding aids, or other examples of secondary material and discuss their merits and shortcomings;
- sign the Genealogist's Code of Ethics, signifying your willingness to abide by its tenets;
- •complete the other requirements in the category for which you are applying and which are discussed in the Applications Guide.

As an applicant for Certified Genealogical Record Specialist (CGRS), you will be asked to:

- *submit copies of three research reports that demonstrate your ability to find records efficiently and interpret them correctly; such reports should span a variety of published and unpublished sources relating to the geographical area(s) in which you seek certification; they need not be client reports, if you do not plan to seek clients;
- •discuss two types of resources you frequently examine (censuses, deeds, vital records, etc.), detailing the genealogical functions of each, the information revealed and the accuracy and deficiences of those sources —giving examples of each.
- choose two primary-source documents and prepare both abstracts and transcripts.

THE JUDGING PROCESS:

When you submit the requested material, your presentation will be forwarded to three judges chosen from a rotating panel of national-level experts. Each will appraise your application without knowledge of the evaluation made by the others. Each will prepare for you an analysis of your personal strengths and weaknesses, as well as the caliber of your experience in the field. Their evaluations and comments

(anonymously written), along with your application packet, will be returned to you within a time frame of about three months. Upon acceptance, you will join a select group of professionals that publicly makes a commitment to the maintenance of quality and public confidence in the field of genealogy. You will have made an important step in your professional growth--a step that will reap benefits for years to come.

OTHER CREDENTIALS USED WITHIN AMERICAN GENEALOGY

Note: Aside from the Board for Certification of Genealogists, which was established as a nonprofit agency in 1964, there are several other agencies, societies, and organizations that accord widely respected credentials or honorific initials to genealogists. The following cross-agency list of those nationally and internationally recognized also includes the BCG categories:³

- A.G.—Accredited Genealogist. One who has passed the rigorous tests administered by the Family History Library (FHL) of Salt Lake City.
- C.A.L.L.S.—Certified American Indian Lineage Specialist. One who has passed the rigorous tests administered in this specialty by BCG since 1976.
- C.A.L.S.—Certified American Lineage Specialist. One who has passed the rigorous tests administered in this specialty by BCG since 1969.
- C.G.—Certified Genealogist. One who has passed the rigorous tests administered in this specialty by BCG since 1969.
- C.G.I.—Certified Genealogical Instructor. One who has passed the rigorous tests administered in this specialty by BCG since 1983.
- C.G.R.S.—Certified Genealogical Record Specialist. One who has passed the rigorous tests administered in this specialty by BCG since 1964.

- DIP. F.H.S.—Diploma—Family History Studies. Awarded by the Society of Australian Genealogists to those who take its course of study and subsequently pass its rigorous exams.
- F.A.S.G.—Fellow of the American Society of Genealogists. Fellowship in ASG, an honor society established in 1940, is limited to fifty living inductees elected on the basis of their genealogical scholarship -- as evidenced by the quality and extent of their publications. An F.A.S.G. is tapped without prior knowledge of his or her consideration as a candidate for the honor.
- F.I.G.R.S.—Fellow of the Irish Genealogical Research Society (Ireland). An honor accorded in recognition of outstanding service to the society and/or contributions to Irish genealogy.
- F.S.G.—Fellow of the Society of Genealogists (London). An honor accorded in recognition of outstanding service to the society and/or worthy contributions to British genealogy.
- F.U.G.A.—Fellow of the Utah Genealogical Association (International). An honor accorded in recognition of outstanding service to the society and/or worthy contributions to genealogy at large.

SEARCHING FOR DICKSON COUNTY ANCESTORS

Dickson County was formed in 1803 by an Act of the Tennessee General Assembly. A petition from citizens of Robertson and Montgomery counties were responsible for this act. The county was named for William Dickson who was a young Nashville physician and statesman who was serving in Congress at the time. Dickson was born in Duplin County, North Carolina in 1770 and by 1795 he had established a practice in Nashville. Although he never lived in Dickson County, many of his descendants did.

Before the white man came to the area, Indians had settled there. Among the tribes were the Cherokee, Chickasaw and a tribe known simply as "Moundbuilders", about whom little is known. The tribe did, however, leave evidence of its presence in Dickson and other counties in Middle and West Tennessee. They built large mounds which were used primarily for burial grounds, especially for the tribal chieftains. The capitol in Nashville, for example, is located on a mound said to have been built by these people. The various Indian tribes were also responsible for building trails which were used by the white man. The Natchez Trace being one example.

The Dickson County records, for the most part, still exist from the formation of the county. There are a few gaps and this will be covered in more detail when each record type is discussed. According to Goodspeed's History, in May 1830 there was a hurricane which destroyed the court house and jail, including many of the early records.⁵

Deeds (1804-present)

Dickson County is one of the fortunate counties in that all of their deed books are still in existence. Of interest to the beginning genealogist concerning the index to the Dickson County deed books: The index is double-columned on each page, unlike most county indexes.

Probate Records (1803-present)

It appears that the Dickson County probate records (at least in the bound volumes) are complete. As far as the

writer knows, "loose" records do not exist. (They were probably destroyed in the 1830 hurricane).

Marriages (1817-present)

Unfortunately, in most counties in Tennessee, there are few marriage records before 1838. However, there are a few for Dickson County dating back to 1817 and these (from 1817-1837) are in "loose" record form. The loose records from 1817-1856 have been arranged and indexed by Sherry Kilgore. In 1837, the Tennessee Legislature passed a law requiring all counties to record their marriages in bound volumes. However, in some instances even a few years may still be missing. From a personal experience, this writer knows that the marriages for November 1848-1857 are missing in the bound volumes but do exist in the loose records. It should be noted that the marriages from 1817-1870 have been indexed, both by grooms' and brides' names, by Byron Sistler & Associates and appear in a separate book for Dickson County as well as being incorporated in the Middle Tennessee publication of the State-wide marriages by the Sistler. Both of these books are available in the Tennessee State Library and Archives as well as being for sale by the Sistlers.

County Court Minutes (1804-present)

Unless some court minute books have been located without the writer's knowledge, the following years are missing for Dickson County:

Feb. 1807 - Dec. 1811
Feb. 1815 - Feb. 1816
Apr. 1822 - Sept 1823
Aug. 1828 - June 1830
Jan. 1853 - Apr. 1861

The early county courts only met every quarter. Therefore some of the missing months cited above may have been recorded in the next quarter's business.

Circuit Court Minutes (1810-present)

Book 1 of the Dickson County Circuit Court Minutes begins in 1810. The earlier minutes were probably recorded in the county court (1803-1809). They could have been recorded in Montgomery County but, unfortunately, the Montgomery Circuit court books before 1896 no longer exist

Chancery Court Minutes (1836-present)

According to Goodspeed, the Chancery Court Minutes for Dickson County before 1836 were recorded in Montgomery County. However, the books in Montgomery County do not exist before 1840.

Note: Just as a reminder in dealing with court minutes, one should always check all courts, county, circuit and chancery of the county as well as court records of the surrounding counties. Also bear in mind that each county had its own way of conducting business and what you may find in one court in a given county may differ in the next.

Tax Lists (1831-present)

The bound volumes of the tax books from 1837-1846 are missing but there are loose tax lists on file in the Tennessee State Library and Archives for the years 1839 and 1841. The list for 1841 is described as being a census of white male inhabitants. Other early years that appear to be missing are 1872, 1879 and 1884.

Cemetery Records

Two volumes of cemetery records for Dickson County have been published by Jill Knight Garrett and these are available at the Tennessee State Library and Archives.

HICKMAN COUNTY NEWS 43 YEARS AGO

A few weeks since one of the oldest persons that ever lived in our county, died - Gander Phillips, colored - aged about 113 years. He was brought to this county as a slave, by William Phillips - grandfather of Mr. J. H. Phillips of our town from the late war, Granderson attended an auction sale of the effects of Millington Easley, deceased, and there bid on and purchased his wife, who was then very old, for five dollar. His wife died about three years ago, at the age of about 105 years.

REVOLUTIONARY WAR CLAIM OF ELIAS LUNSFORD

State of	Tennessee	} -	Deci	larati	or
Stewart	County]	}			

I, Elias Lunsford make oath that I am a resident of the County of Stewart and State of Tennessee and am a native born citizen of the United States; that I was born 1st day of May 1713, being now 117 years of age.

I first enlisted in the Old Continental Army in the State of Virginia, being at the time a resident of Northumberland Ctv, VA, in a company commanded by one Thomas Gaskin & upon him being soon after promoted to the command of Col., I belonged to his regiment, it being the 5th Reg. of the Continental line. But at what particular time I enlisted I cannot now recollect but know it was early in the Revolutionary War and for the term of 3 years; Having served for the whole of that time, I then enlisted for 3 years again and at the expiration of that time I enlisted for 6 months and had the honor of being at the Seige of York. I was then discharged from Service in the State of VA; and do not believe that my name is on the roll of any State except that of VA. I hereby relinquish my claim whatsoever to a pension except the present and the reason why I have not made application sooner is that heretofore I did not need it and disdained so long as I had property or was able to work for a support, to call upon a generous govt, for aid. But old age and poverty combined have produced the necessity of presenting my claim upon this county of govt. I solemnly swear I was a resident of the U.S. on the 18th of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift, sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof to diminish it so to bring it within the provisions of the Act of Congress passed on the 18th of March 1818, and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me contracts or debts due me, nor have I any income whereby I may obtain a living - My situation is extremely dependant, being old, weak and feeble, struggling in the want of poverty. I have no schedule to give of property nor of sales or gifts of any ... contract. My subsistence in future, as it has been for a long time past, to be drawn from my children who are themselves principally daughters who are single and extremely poor, so much so as to be scarcely able to support themselves. Sworn to and declared on this 24th day of March 1830 before the Honble Parry W. Humphreys, Judge of the 5th Judicial District in open Court; it being a Court of Record and in the Town of Dover, Stewart County.

I, John H. Clements, Clerk of the Circuit Court of Stewart County, TN, do certify that it appears to the satisfaction of the Court that the said Elias Lundsford did serve in the Revolutionary War as stated in the preceding declaration against the common enemy for the Term of 3 years under one engagement, 3 years under another and 6 months under a third ... a claim on the continential establishment according to his own oath. I also certify that the foregoing oath is truly copied from the record of the said Court. New Genealogy Software and Upgrades

The Family History Department of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints announced on Dec. 6, 1993 availability of PAF2.3 (Personal Ancestral File) for registered users of PAF software. The upgrade version of PAF 2.3 can be ordered through January 1995 for \$4.00. If you have not received your notice or have questions about PAF software, call 1-800-346-6044.

ROOTS IV is now available and has many new features in addition to those found in ROOTS III. COMMSOFT recommends using at least a 386sx computer with 4 MB RAM and a minimum of 15 MB of hard disk space or 20 MB if you have more than 1000 individuals in your data base. ROOTS IV features pull-down menus that allow you to move from window to window, compare events, connect individuals to events, and enter data exactly the way you want. A demo disk is available on request.

REUNION, originally developed for the Macintosh computer by Leister Productions, is now available for Windows. This program requires at least 2 MB of RAM and 2 MB of hard disk space. Reunion makes use of "smart icons" to aid users to rapidly invoke functions of the program. Chart lovers will appreciate the capabilities of Reunion's SuperChart program and the ability to output records directly to your word processor for final formatting and printing. A demo disk is available on request.

Family Tree Maker for Windows requires a 386 computer, at least 2 MB of RAM (4 MB advised) and at least 3 MB of hard disk space. If you are using the DOS version of Family Tree Maker and have Windows on your computer, then you should get this upgrade. The Windows version can hold up to one million names, is easy to use and gives you more flexibility to customize your charts and reports.

FAMILY ORIGINS for Windows requires 4 MB of RAM and 1 MB of hard disk space. This up-date now includes a built-in note editor that allows you to record a note with three sources for each event in a person's record. A relationship calculator is included along with an icon/tool bar that makes it easy to add or edit records.

Upgrades of WordPerfect 6.0 for DOS or Windows, and Microsoft Word 6.0 for Windows are available from local sources such as Radio Shack, Sam's and other computer stores for about \$100. One mail order source, MicroWarehouse, 1-800-367-6808, will accept credit cards, lists WordPerfect for \$99.95, and Microsoft Word for \$95.95.

If you have an older version of MS-DOS, you might consider an upgrade to MS-DOS 6.2 for about \$50. The 6.2 version includes DoubleSpace, a virus detection program and several other new features. DoubleSpace is an integrated compression program that can double your hard disk's capacity.

Computer system upgrade

You would like to try Windows and some new Windows programs but don't have enough memory in your computer? You can't use the new Roots IV or replace an older version of a genealogy program with a newer program because your hard disk is full? Maybe you are thinking about buying a new color monitor or printer, adding a modem, maybe a scanner to your computer system? Such questions and concerns are not uncommon among genealogists but the question of whether to upgrade your computer system is very difficult to answer.

If you are the owner of an older 285 AT or XT model PC, upgrading might not be feasible. The cost of components to upgrade could exceed the cost of a new compter with more features. The older machines are very slow and if the power supply is only 100 watts, then it would need replacing. Most new machines have a 200 to 250 watt power supply. Often the older systems did not provide extra slots or cable connections for add-ons such as a modem, fax, CD, sound card, hard drive or scanner. Sometimes the cabinet or case that contains the computer system is too small or is too crowded to add anything else. Further complications can arise if the BIOS, disk controller, or other components such as the video card for the monitor aren't compatible with the newer up-grades.

Don't despair however, a memory upgrade and replacing your hard drive might be a good option to consider. A 1 MB SIMM memory upgrade is less than \$50 and a 4 MB SIMM is about \$175 or less. If you plan to replace your old drive be sure to backup your files and know how to reinstall DOS on the new drive. If your old drive has 120 MB or more of disk space, then consider adding a second drive. Check your computer to see if you have room for it and the disk controller has power supply and cable connectors for another drive. Most systems will allow you to designate the C: drive as the master and the second or D: drive as the slave. Be sure to follow manufacturers directions for the correct settings on each drive. You can have a maximum of two 500 MB IDE hard drives unless you have a SCSI controller for your hard drive.

A hard disk drive with less than 250 MB capacity is not recommended. The cost at the present time for a megabite of memory is under one dollar. Sooner or later you will run out of memory and the additional cost for a 350 to 500 MB hard drive is not that much more in comparison to a 120 MB drive. For example, the list price for a Western Digital 170 MB IDE drive is \$209 and a 250 MB IDE drive is \$219 but the price of a 420 MB IDE drive is \$339, a difference of only \$130 for more than twice the capacity of the 170 MB drive.

Many new programs, such as Roots IV, need 20 MB of free hard disk space for a data base of 1,000 individuals. If you have more than 1,000 individuals in your data base, then another 5 MB is needed for each additional 1,000 individuals. Just installing Windows without Word Perfect or any other word processor will take another 15-20 MB of disk space. Upgrading an older version of MS DOS to 6.2 could be a partial answer if you are running out of disk space. MS DOS 6.2 includes a program called DoubleSpace that allows you to compress files and free up disk space. Keep in mind however, a computer with less than 4 MB of RAM is barely acceptable for running Windows.

A modem is needed for access to Prodigy, CompuServe, Genie and other computer bulletin boards such as the National Genealogical Society or local services in the Nashville area. An internal modem and software package can be purchased for about \$100. Installation is easy and doesn't require a lot of technical skill.

A scanner can be useful in converting printed materials and photographs into a digital form that can be used with your word processor and genealogy program files. However, a good scanner and software are expensive, can be very time consuming and the results might not be what you had expected. Also consider the amount of disk space and RAM that will be needed.

A laser or inkjet printer can be a real asset if you are writing a family history and want to have some nice charts. The prices of laser printers are now under \$600 and inkjet printers sell for less than \$300, about the same price as the best of the 24 pin dot matrix printers.

A CD-ROM drive and sound card for audio would be useful if you are interested in games and educational materials. You might also consider obtaining a phonebook CD-ROM with more than 90 million names on one CD or one of the more than 50 CD's available for genealogy research. Family History Centers at LDS Churches, some colleges and many public libraries now have a collection of genealogy CD's. Multimedia kits containing a double speed internal or external CD-ROM drive with speakers, audio card, and software vary in price from \$300 to \$500.

When considering purchase of a new color monitor, be sure it is noninterlaced, has a .28mm dot pitch and a 72Hz or higher vertical refresh rate. If you are looking at a new computer system don't settle for anything less than a VLB SuperVGA video card with at least 1 MB RAM and a Windows accelerator, a 340 MB hard drive, 8 MB of RAM, at least 128K of cache, 486 processor with a VLB or VESA data bus. A Cyrix 486 processor is less expensive than Intel and runs slightly slower. You will want at least eight slots on the motherboard, two of them being VLB and the rest sixteen bit slots. Also get both a 3.5" HD and 5.25" HD floppy drives. Don't pay extra for bundled software. You should get MS DOS 6.2 and Windows 3.1 installed at no extra cost but make sure you get the diskettes and manuals. A mouse, mouse pad, and modem are usually included as part of the system. Don't hesitate to compare price and features when shopping for a computer, software or upgrades and related equipment. Mail order shopping is not difficult and is usually less expensive. Pick up a copy of Computer Shopper or one of the other computer magazines at a nearby bookstore and compare prices.

BOOK REVIEWS

Summer County, Tennessee Bond Book 1787-1835, abstracted by Shirley Wilson, C. G. Soft cover 8½ x 11, 31 pp., copyright 1994. Order from The Sumner County Archives, 155 E. Main Street, Gallatin, TN 37066. \$7.00 plus \$1.00 shipping.

For those interested in Sumner County history and genealogy, this slim volume contains important new material. The Bond Book has never been microfilmed and has not previously been available for research. The earliest document in the book is dated 17 August 1784. Included are bonds for marriages, estate administrations, apprenticeships, guardianships, title to land, and emancipation of slaves. Numerous other interesting documents, such as letters, agreements, powers of attorney and an occasional deed are also recorded.

A complete name and place index is inserted, while the abstracts contain enough information to determine whether a particular bond is of interest. Armed with this information, one can order originals, which provide additional information such as ages, relationships and professions, from the Sumner County Archives.

This work, carefully read and abstracted by Shirley Wilson, Certified Genealogist, and published by the Sumner County Archives, should be on the shelf of every person who is involved in early Sumner County research. DWP, Guest Reviewer.

This book contains abstracts of Deed Books D, E, F, and G in Logan County and is a helpful supplement to Murray's first book on Logan County deeds covering the earlier time period of 1792 to 1813. Family researchers who don't consider deeds an important source of information need only read the first abstract in Murray's book to learn otherwise. It's a power of attorney which identifies the maiden name of John Gallaher's wife Polly when Amos Edwards was appointed as their attorney in 1813.

The index is excellent. It includes complete names and there is also a place index and a slave index.

Tombstone Records of Cheatham County, Tennessee edited by Denis Dozier Haile and James E. Garrett, Jr. Spiral bound, 8 1/2 x 11, 231 pp., complete name index, copyright 1987. Purchase from Byron Sistler & Associates \$25.00 plus \$3.50 shipping and handling per order.

This is a project of The Heritage/Roots Committee of Cheatham County and they are to be commended for their work in preparing this volume. The book contains a listing of the cemeteries included, some of which are located outside the boundaries of Cheatham County.

The complete name index is to the cemetery number and the cemeteries themselves are arranged in alphabetical order, making it easy to find an entry. By using the number sign(#) in the index, it is immediately clear to the reader that this is not a page number index.

Hight-Hite Families of Sussex and Surry Counties, Virginia from about 1634 by Robert E. Wallace. Softbound 8 1/2 x 11, 182 pp., copyright 1976, complete name index. Order from Heritage Books Inc., 1540-E Pointer Ridge Pl., Bowie MD20716 \$27.50 plus \$3 shipping and handling.

1,333 descendants of John Hight, who was born about 1634 and came to Virginia about 1656, are included in this work. Descendants moved to Georgia, Tennessee, Alabama, Texas and North Carolina. Other surnames included are Acres, Augusta, Bacon, Chambly, Cotton, Demastus, Duffer, Gee, Hurlow, Hopkins, Hudson, Jones, Mahen, McDaniel, Neblett, Sheffield, Simmons and Ystrom.

Wallace has used a variation of the New England Register System for the numbering system, which greatly simplifies tracking individuals through the book. While there is no footnoting, copies of deeds, wills, tax lists, cemetery records, extracts from parish registers and listings from city directories enhance the value of the book. There is an excellent every name index to the ancestor's number. It's located after the family history and before the copies of documents. This arrangement places it in the center of the book, where researchers in a rush to determine if their ancestor is listed could miss it.

Nashville's Old City Cemetery compiled by Lib Roller. Softbound 8 1/2 x 11, 84 pp., no index. Order from Ms. Lib Roller, 3912 Caylor Drive, Nashville, TN 37215 \$6.00 plus \$1.25 shipping.

Opened in 1822 and officially closed in 1855 except to those owning lots in it, Old City Cemetery contains the graves of many prominent Nashvillians. A history of Old City Cemetery is given in the first of three sections in this publication. The second section includes photographs of some of the unusual monuments of famous and not so famous people buried in the cemetery. The third section is entitled "Bible Records and Tombstone Inscriptions of People Buried in the City Cemetery." This portion includes a listing of "Prominent People Buried There," followed by an alphabetical listing of inscriptions and several supplemental listings.

This book is well worth its modest publication price and contains much valuable information, although the precise source of the information is sometimes difficult to ascertain. The lack of a master index can be partially overcome by using the book in combination with the Tennessee State Library and Archives publication Index to Interments in the Nashville City Cemetery 1846-1962, published in 1964.

This is the War Department Report of 1839, in two sections. The first section is a list of persons who claim pensions on account of wounds and other injuries alleged to have been received while in the service of the United States, and whose claims have not been admitted. The second section is a report listing the names and residences of widows and orphans whose claims, under the act of the 4th of July, 1836, have been rejected.

Although few Tennesseans are included in this limited listing, the reasons for the claims being rejected provide interesting bits of information - for example, "Her husband deserted" was given as one reason for rejection.

Note: an asterisk after the name means this person was included with another household. [B]=black The first number is the age of the person listed. The number in parentheses is the page number of the microfilmed original.

MINUTES OF THE SUPERIOR COURT OF NORTH CAROLINA AND MERO DISTRICT

Abstracted by Dorothy Scott Johnson

At the time the Mero District was organized it included most of what is now Middle Tennessee and North Carolina claimed ownership of the Tennessee region. Thus the original name of the Court was "Superior Court of North Carolina, including Mero District." This court convened from 1788 until 1809.

In the 1930's the WPA Writers' Project transcribed minutes of this Court and entered them in four books which were then placed in the Tennessee State Library and Archives. What happened to the originals of these minutes seems to be unknown; they cannot be found at the State Library today, either in original or microfilmed form. Occasionally someone will erroneously cite the Davidson County Court minutes of the period as belonging to the Mero District, but perusal of those minutes prove conclusively that they are not the same. As a consequence, when publishing the Mero District court records we are limited to copying the WPA books instead of the originals.

All legal definitions or explanations are taken from *Black's Law Dictionary*, *Fifth Edition* which will hereafter be referred to as "Black's." Many abbreviations in this work are not in Black's and appear to be the original clerk's own brand of legal shorthand. Since no log exists explaining the meaning of these abbreviations it is necessary to use them as they are written.

The page numbers given here are the pages of the WPA typed material, not the original page numbers unless so stated.

S. Gov't. under the auspices of Genl. E. A. Payne....

Secondly I give and bequeath to my beloved son Jesse Jones the premises whereon I now reside with all its appurtenances containing four hundred acres of land be the same more or less provided that the said Jesse Jones continue on and take care of myself and [my] well beloved wife Elizabeth Jones during our natural lives But should the said Jessee Jones fail so to do I direct that the above named premises be for a home and support for my beloved wife Elizabeth Jones and at her decease to be sold and the proceeds to be equally divided among all my children (viz) Sarah Hudson, Leonard Jones William Jones Elizabeth Huchinson Samuel Jones Jacob Jones Barbry Springer Richard Jones Polly Wallis Jesse Springer.

Thirdly that out of my personal property each of my above named children shall have the sum of ten dollars or so much of my personal property to be sold on twelve months credit as will pay to each legatee the sum of ten dollars.

In the next place I will to my beloved daughter Polly Wallace two beds and furniture one young horse beast one cow and calf and lastly I will that my son Jesse Jones have all the balance of my household and personal property provided he on his part take care of the farm and property and take good care of myself and wife during our natural lives.

I do hereby make and ordain and appoint my esteemed neighbor William Holland executor of this my last will and testament in witness I Samuel Jones the said testator have to this my will written on one half sheet of paper set my hand and seal this twenty third day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred forty two signed sealed and published in the presence of the testator and of each other. [signed] Samuel Jones
