Find out how old they are and how you can preserve them. The meeting will be at the Knowles Senior Citizens Center, 174 Rains Avenue, Nashville on March 17, 2007, at 1:00 p. m. Wear green. It's St. Patrick's Day.

The presentation on "Identifying and Dating Old Photographs" will be given by Amber Barfield, Documents Conservator at the Tennessee State Library and Archives. Amber is a graduate of David Lipscomb University with a major in communications and an MA from MTSU in public History with emphasis in museums. Past experience includes being Historian at the Parthenon and Photographic Archivist at the Metro Archives.

The Knowles Center is on the Tennessee State Fairgrounds property at the Wedgewood Avenue entrance. Take I-65 going north or south and exit at Exit #81. Go east to the Fairgrounds entrance. The gate to the Knowles Center off Wedgewood Avenue will be open for the meeting. You also can enter from Rains Avenue by punching the button for the gate to open.

It will be held at the Knowles Center (directions above). Admission will be free. Dr. Morton-Young was the recipient of the 2006 Athena Award. She is the owner of a publishing company and conducts tours of historic Black sites in Nashville. She is also the author of "Afro American Genealogy Sourcebook."

The other bargain sale is the "Every Name Index to 18 Middle Tennessee Record Books." The book was published in 1992 by Bryon and Samuel Sistler. The sale price is \$10.00. The book originally sold for \$39.00. The book is an integrated index of 18 county record books from three counties, Bedford (covering 9 books), Giles (covering 8 books), and Lincoln (covering 1 book). There are 165,000 entries. It is a great time saver for research in those counties.
