This is the annual election of officers, as well as the 2011 awards program. Paul R. White, who served as judge for the best article in the 2009-2010 MTGS *Journal*, will be the speaker. Mr. White, a Nashville attorney and genealogist, has written genealogical and historical books and articles and is a member of several genealogical and historical groups...as well as the Rolls-Royce, the Cadillac-LaSalle, and the Buick & Riviera Owners Associations. He has presented three legal workshops for MTGS and is working toward certification through the Board for Certification of Genealogists.
