The *Middle Tennessee Genealogical Society* has registered as a partner Society with FamilySearch.org to help rally volunteers to index the 1940 Census. FamilySearch.org is a free website devoted to sharing historical and genealogical records with everyone. Through a nation-wide, joint effort, the 1940 U.S. Census will be indexed by thousands of volunteers.
