The next meeting of the Middle Tennessee Genealogical Society will be on May 17 at 1:00 at the FiftyForward Center, 174 Raines Avenue, Nashville. This meeting features the annual awards presentation. Myers Brown will be the speaker, as well as the judge for best article in the past year's Journal. A native of Old Hickory, Tennessee, Mr. Brown has degrees in history from Oglethorpe and Middle Tennessee State Universities. He is currently an archivist at the Tennessee State Library and Archives, concentrating in the Archives Development Program. His extensive background includes being a Fellow and a Governor of the Company of Military Historians, chairman of the Tennessee War of 1812 Bicentennial Commission, Curator of the Tennessee State Museum, member of the Alabama Historical Commission, and Curator of Military History at the Atlanta History Center. He has authored 2 books, Images of Tennessee Union Cavalrymen and Images of Tennessee Confederates. His last work, as editor of the Tennessee Historical Quarterly, was about Nathan Bedford Forrest.

The annual Promise Land Community Club Festival will be held May 30-June 1 in Dickson County. Promise Land was the first community founded by formerly enslaved people in Dickson County, and the annual festival features music, food, reenactors, and other fun. The one-teacher school has been restored to its original condition as a museum and is on both the Civil War Trail and the Historic Register. A traveling exhibit from the Smithsonian's Museum of African American History will be on display. Only fifty sites nationwide, most of them universities, will receive this exhibit, so Promise Land's inclusion is a real honor. Most events will take place on Saturday, May 31.
