CONSERVATION is the theme for the next MTGS meeting on Saturday, September 15, 2007, at 1:00 p.m. at the Martin Center, 960 Heritage Way, Brentwood, TN. NOTE THE CHANGE OF VENUE. "Artifacts for Future Generations" is the topic. Christine Young, a Nashville Conservator of photographic materials and art on paper will present. She will focus on what the average layperson can do to extend the life of paper documents and photographs.

MARK YOUR CALENDARS FOR NOVEMBER 17, 2007 for the fall highlight – our all-day seminar. "Using Land Records to Find Your Ancestors – Even If They Did Not Own Land" is the theme and three speakers will be featured:

"Understanding State and Public Land Records" is a comparison of the two basic types of land records and how they benefit the researcher. The process of acquiring land will be explained under both systems and the ability to pinpoint the location of the land in public land states will be demonstrated.

The presenter will be Shirley Wilson, Certified Genealogist, author, retired director and one of the founders of the Sumner County Archives. She taught genealogy at Volunteer State Community College for 25 years, serves on the TN Historical Records Advisory Board, is a past president of *MTGS* and is currently our Book Review Editor.

"There's Gold in Them Thar' Deed Books" addresses how to correctly access and use deed books enabling the genealogist to place a family in the correct geographical location, sort out men of the same name in the same area, determine family relationships, and find hidden details about a family that can be found in no other source.

The presenter will be Marie Martin Murphy, Certified Genealogical Research Specialist, lecturer, instructor at the Virginia Institute sponsored by the VA Genealogical Society, an alumna of the Institute of Genealogical and Historical Research at Samford Univ., Birmingham, and of the National Institute of Genealogical Research in Washington, D.C. and a member of the Association of Professional Genealogists.

"Land Platting Workshop" will focus on the process of creating a plat map from a metes and bounds deed; includes forms and step-by-step instructions for platting the land and placing it in context on a topographical map. The hands-on portion includes several deeds that encourage understanding and

practical use. Equipment for the workshop will be provided and topographical maps to use will be available for sale.

This workshop will be conducted by J. Mark Lowe, Certified Genealogist and a full-time professional genealogist. A specialist in Tennessee and Kentucky resources, he is a national and regional speaker, author, served as Director of the Regional In-depth Genealogical Studies Alliance, Vice President of Development for the Federation of Genealogical Societies, Vice President of the Genealogical Speakers Guild, and is past president of the Southern Kentucky Genealogical Society.
