The program will be presented by **Mr. Mark Strength**, a successful businessman, as well as a researcher and novelist. Mr. Strength has written two historical novels about **Bonny Kate**, aka Mrs. John Sevier. Join us for an afternoon of fascinating stories about these early settlers of East Tennessee. Refreshments will be served.

On Wednesday, September 30, **Bob Dennison** will present a program on "**Using Family TreeMaker, New Version 9**" at the FiftyForward/Knowles Center (10:30am – 12:30pm) in Nashville.
