We will have a guided tour of the Nashville Room, and then proceed to the adjacent Civil Rights Room, where we will learn about the room and view a short documentary film on Nashville's involvement in the Civil Rights movement. We will then proceed up to the 3rd floor for a guided tour of the Metro-Davidson County Archives from Archivist Ken Fieth.

The meeting is open to the public. Parking is available in the garage below the library, with the first 90 minutes free (with Library validation). The Library will be open until 6:00pm, if you want to stay and research at the Metro Archives after the tour. Join us for a tour of this great building and its historic resources.

Thanks to those who attended the DNA chat session following our May meeting, led by Dr. Dave Dowell. Based on feedback we received, we look forward to hosting another chat session, likely in conjunction with our September regular meeting.

MTGS will host a hands-on Conservation of Manuscripts and Documents workshop on Saturday, August 11 from 9:30am – 11:30am, at the Tennessee State Library and Archives Auditorium, conducted by Carol Roberts, Conservation Manager, and Stewart Southard, Conservation Technician, of the Preservation Services Section at TSLA.

Registrants will bring 1-2 documents, no larger than 8"x10", and receive instruction on how to clean, deacidify and encapsulate them for long-term preservation.

The workshop fee is \$35, which includes conservation supplies and handouts. Registration will be limited to 30 attendees and will open on Saturday, July 21, at the MTGS regular meeting.

The Portland Genealogy Club will be taking a field trip to the Tennessee State Library and Archives on Saturday, August 4th. If you have signed up to carpool, meet at the Portland Library at 9:45 am. If you want to meet them there, they will have a tour by Gordon Belt at 10:30 am.
