

A former Director of the Public Record Office of Northern Ireland and Chairman of the Irish Manuscripts Commission, he has held a lecturing post in history at Queen's University, Belfast, and a fellowship with the Institute of Historical Research, London.

Educated at St. Columb's College, Derry, and Queen's University, Belfast, he holds a 1st Class Honors degree in History and has been awarded a Doctorate of Letters from the University of Ulster and a Doctorate of Law from the National University of Ireland.
