At the just-concluded RootsTech conference in Salt Lake City, significant DNA product announcements were made by both Ancestry and by MyHeritage that have caused quite a buzz among DNA researchers.

Both Ancestry's ThruLines feature and MyHeritage's Theory of Family Relativity offer new insights into how we *might* be kin to our DNA matches, even when those matches do not have fully-filled out online trees that show a shared surname. These insights combine DNA hints plus record groups available through each company, and offer tantalizing suggestions of specific family connections.

Keep in mind that these new features are merely suggestions of kinship, and that traditional, paper-based research is still required to prove out these suggestions!

If you are researching in a 'burned' Tennessee county, don't forget about the Supreme Court cases held at TSLA, as they may be the only surviving copies of court cases for a burned county.
