Our program will be presented by Melissa Barker, Houston County Archivist and Certified Archives Manager. Her program will be *Loose Records in an Archive: What Are They?*

Melissa is a Professional Genealogist who lectures, teaches, and writes about researching in archives and records preservation. She writes the popular blog, <u>A Genealogist in the Archives</u>. She is Reviews Editor for the Federation of Genealogical Societies (FGS) magazine, <u>FORUM</u>. Her bi-weekly advice column, The Archive Lady, can be viewed at <u>abundantgenealogy.com</u>.
