It's heartbreaking to see the loss of historic structures and records in Loudon, Tennessee, due to the <u>fire in the historic courthouse</u>. Reports that many of the historic records had been removed from the courthouse for indexing seem to be incorrect. Thankfully, <u>TSLA's Loudon County microfilm inventory</u> reveals that most of the historic bound volumes from the courthouse had been microfilmed. However, the inventory does not mention that any of the loose records had been microfilmed.

Are the records in your county well-preserved? Reach out to <u>your local</u> <u>County Archives</u> and find out how you can volunteer in preservation efforts.
