This year's theme is *Judgment, War, Taxes, and Tales: A Day Among the Records* and will feature local speakers Gordon Belt, Allison Griffey, Jim Long, and Chuck Sherrill. Registration deadline is <u>November 12</u> and the cost is \$40 for members of either MTGS or the Tennessee Historical Society; nonmembers' charge is \$45. Lunch is included.

Doors will open at 8:15, with program beginning at 9:00. Final session will include a question and answer session for the presenters and we'll be finished at 4:00 p.m.

Several helpful online resources have been announced recently. The Virginia Historical Society now has a database called "Unknown No Longer." This provides access to the VHS unpublished manuscripts relating to Virginians of African descent. The Society holds more than 8 million processed items in its collection; they can now be accessed at http://unknownnolonger.vahistorical.org/search/results.

Another potential resource is "Book-A-Librarian." Researchers can schedule a thirty-minute one-on-one consultation with a reference librarian at certain libraries. Although only a few libraries are listed, the blogpost says others are participating. We can only hope that many more decide to make the service available.
