He is the author of <u>Taproots: a Virginia Carolina Legacy</u> (1978, 1986) as well as numerous articles for genealogical and historical journals. His hobbies include genealogical and historical reading, research, and writing--and collecting antique cars. He is a member of The Nashville and Tennessee Bar Associations, Sons of the American Revolution, Sons of Confederate Veterans, The Huguenot Society, and a variety of antique car clubs.
